WHAT MEASURE L MEANS FOR STANISLAUS COUNTY



Revenues available to operate, maintain and improve our transportation system have not kept up with the needs of our community.

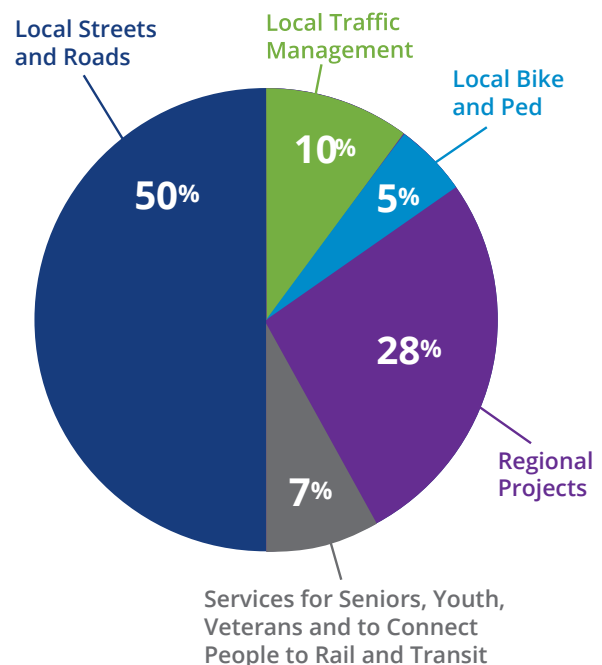
In November 2016, voters will be asked to consider Measure L, a ½ cent sales tax to address these needs.

Counties that have implemented local sales tax measures for transportation, called "Self-Help Counties," are able to do more themselves and are more successful in leveraging a larger share of state and federal dollars.

This plan will:

- **Preserve existing infrastructure and improve neighborhoods**, including funds to every city and the County to repave streets, fill potholes, and upgrade local transportation infrastructure.
- **Provide transit system preservation and improvements**, by making capital and operational investments.
- **Reduce traffic congestion** by eliminating bottlenecks and improving commute reliability.
- **Triple funding for point-to-point services** for seniors, veterans and people with disabilities based on current estimates.
- **Improve safety** for motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians.
- **Promote economic development** in Stanislaus County that support residents and businesses.
- **Measure L Oversight Committee** to ensure funds are allocated properly and spent on the proposed projects.

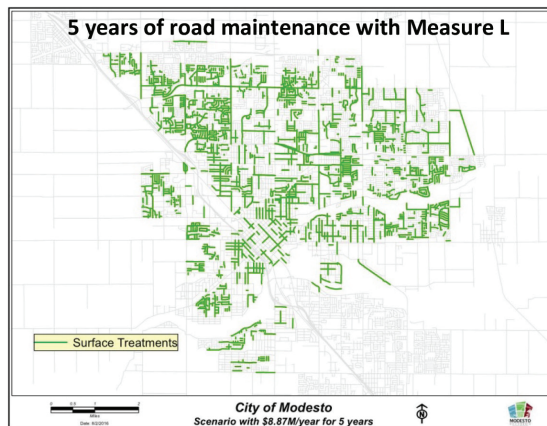
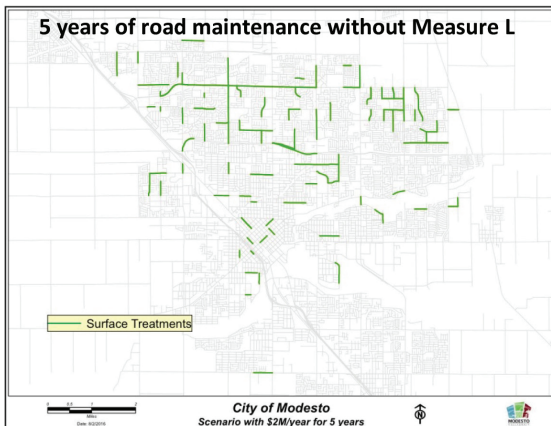
PROPOSED EXPENDITURE PLAN*



PROPOSED INVESTMENTS FOR MODESTO

LOCAL STREET AND ROAD IMPROVEMENTS (50%)

- Funding from Measure L will provide sufficient revenue to treat every residential street 3 times in 25 years.
- Measure L provides \$171,868,971* for local street maintenance and road repairs.



Measure

L

is a special tax

Funds must be spent on transportation and related projects.

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT (10%) AND BIKE/PED IMPROVEMENTS (5%)

- Provides \$34,373,794* for traffic flow and safety improvements
- Provides \$17,186,897* for bike/pedestrian projects
- Neighborhoods around every school will be enhanced for student safety

REGIONAL PROJECTS

- Upgrade the Briggsmore-Carpenter Interchange
- Construction of a new eight-lane interchange at Standiford
- Complete State Route 132 by constructing a four-lane expressway from State Route 99 to Gates Road
- Provides services for Seniors, Youth, Veterans and Persons with Disabilities to connect people to rail and transit

**All revenue estimates and allocations contained in this Plan are for illustrative purposes. Actual net revenues may fall above or below the projections contained in the Expenditure Plan, therefore actual revenue allocations to each category will be based on the percentages contained herein.*

Strict accountability and performance measures ensure delivery. The 25-year Plan will include strict accountability measures to ensure the funds are spent as directed by voters. It requires open and transparent public processes to allocate funds, including:

- Annual Independent Audits and Compliance Reports
- Measure L Oversight Committee
- Provisions for Maintenance of Effort
- Administrative Costs Maximum of 1%
- Funds Must Stay Local and Only Be Spent on Transportation
- Sunset Date 2042

Don't Leave Grass Clippings and Leaves in Gutters

Join the City of Modesto Environmental Services and Stormwater Collections Sections in keeping grass clippings off the streets and out of the gutters.

Grass clippings placed in the road:

- Are unsightly
- Endanger aquatic life
- Clog storm drains
- Cause flooding
- Can lead to fines
- Increase maintenance costs for taxpayers



The City of Modesto prohibits washing, sweeping or blowing vegetative debris into storm drains, ditches, waterbodies, sidewalks, and gutters. With the exception of leaf season (November 1st – December 31st), no method shall be used to blow or move any non-pruned refuse (including grass clippings and leaves) into the streets at any time. Grass clippings shall always be placed into the green waste container for pickup.

When it rains, grass clippings and other vegetative debris are washed down our storm drains and into our stormwater collection system. If this material does not clog up the system, it often ends up in stormwater basins, creeks, or rivers where they start to decay. This process consumes oxygen in the water while releasing nutrients and it can lead to algae blooms and kill fish.

Green Waste – Leaf & Limb Collection (Residential):

City of Modesto Residential Customers* are eligible for large green waste pick up monthly from your street or alley.

- Green Waste can only be placed out 72 hours prior to the Monday of your collection week.
- Items placed out must be less than six feet in length and six inches in diameter.
- Small Green Waste (grass clippings, vines, twigs and other similar soft vegetative materials) shall be placed in the organic recycling container for collection.
- Leaves may only be placed in the street for collection during the month of December.
- No single piece can weigh over 50 pounds.
- Place materials 18 inches from the curb or fence.
- All materials must be adjacent to the property where they were created.
- No dirt, sod, grass clippings or concrete will be picked up.

The City is divided into four service areas; set out and pick up times depend on your location. Most of the materials are sent to the Compost Facility for processing.

December is leaf season only; green waste will not be collected. Leaves are collected from the street only. Piles of leaves with green waste mixed in will not be collected.

*Does not include residents living on privately owned streets.

Piles placed out too early for collection are subject to code enforcement actions and possible citations.

Move those cans...

Per City of Modesto Municipal Code, where service occurs in the street in front of your home, garbage containers may be placed out only 24 hours prior to and after the service day. Garbage cans must be placed in the street on the asphalt next to the curb or on the edge of the driveway apron. Do not block sidewalks. Pedestrians, handicapped residents and people with strollers have the right-of-way on sidewalks, so it is important to keep sidewalks clear. Help make our community a safer place for everyone by placing your garbage cans in the street.

This does not apply to those residents with alley service. If you have questions about can placement, please call the City of Modesto, Solid Waste office at 577-5493.
