A RESOLUTION REFERRING TO THE MODESTO CITY PLANNING COMMISSION A PETITION FOR ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN UNINHABITED TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF MODESTO, KNOWN AS THE LA LOMA SCHOOL ADDITION.

WHEREAS, a petition has been filed in the office of the City Clerk requesting the annexation of certain uninhabited territory to the City of Modesto, which territory is more specifically described hereinafter, and

WHEREAS, the County Boundary Commission has certified to the definiteness and accuracy of the boundaries of said territory,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Modesto that said petition for the annexation of the following described uninhabited territory be referred to the Planning Commission for its report and recommendation.

The territory herein referred to is situated in the County of Stanislaus, State of California, and more particularly described as follows:

All that certain real property situate in the State of California, County of Stanislaus, being a portion of the East half of the Northeast quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 27, Township 3 South, Range 9 East, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the existing corporate City limits, said point being at the intersection of the Southerly line of Modesto Irrigation District Lateral Number 2 with the Northerly projection of the Westerly line of Rosina Avenue as shown on the map of the Covena Park Tract Number 2 as recorded in Volume 14 of Maps, at Page 49, Stanislaus County Recorder's Office; thence along the existing corporate City limits Southerly along said projection and Westerly line of Rosina Avenue to its intersection with the

Westerly projection of the Northerly line of Lot 16, Block 2031-A of said Covena Park Tract Number 2; thence continuing along the existing corporate City limits, Easterly along said Westerly projection and boundary of said Covena Park Tract Number 2, South 89° 49' 30" East, 658.84 feet to the Westerly line of Conejo Avenue as shown on the map of the Uccello Tract recorded in Volume 16 of Maps, at Page 56, Stanislaus County Recorder's Office, thence continuing along the corporate City Limits, Northerly along said Westerly line of said Conejo Avenue to its intersection with the Westerly projection of the Northerly boundary of said Uccello Tract; thence continuing along the existing corporate City Limits, Easterly along said Westerly projection of the Northerly line of said Uccello Tract to its intersection with the Easterly quarter section line of the Southwest quarter of said Section 27, said line being the Easterly boundary of the Modesto City School property as described in Volume 1269 at Page 26, Stanislaus County Records; thence Northerly along said quarter section line to its intersection with the Southerly line of said Modesto Irrigation District Lateral Number 2; thence Westerly along said Southerly line of Lateral Number 2, to the point of beginning of this description.

WHEREAS, the common welfare, and safety of the lives and property of our citizens, deserves consideration equal to that afforded the peoples of other countries to whom the United States of America has contributed greatly in money and materials,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Modesto that it urge the President of the United States, the Governor of the State of California, the Congress of the United States of America, and the Legislature of the State of California, to bring about the immediate construction of additional reclamation, flood control, and public power projects on the main rivers of this State.

WHEREAS, the floods of December, 1955, caused severe damage in many parts of California, including Stanislaus County, which were declared disaster areas by the Governor of the State of California and by the President of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the City of Modesto suffered damage to its sewage treatment plant as a result of the December, 1955 floods,
and

WHEREAS, a grant of Federal funds for emergency repairs has been made to the City of Modesto under the provisions of Public Law No. 875, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to proceed as quickly as possible to repair the facilities at the sewage treatment plant so that all facilities of the plant may be available when needed, as a breakdown of any treatment unit would leave the City without adequate standby treatment facilities, and

WHEREAS, in response thereto the United States of America, acting through the Administrator of Civil Aeronautics, has submitted an offer to pay a share of the costs incurred in accomplishing the project, the offer being in the following words:

1. The maximum obligation of the United States payable under this Offer shall be \$29,805.00
2. The Co-sponsors shall
 - (a) begin accomplishment of the Project within a reasonable time after acceptance of this Offer, and
 - (b) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the terms of this Offer, and the Federal Airport Act and the Regulations promulgated thereunder by the Administrator in effect on the date of this Offer, which Act and Regulations are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, and
 - (c) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the property map incorporated herein as it may be revised or modified with the approval of the Administrator or his duly authorized representatives.
3. The Co-sponsors shall operate and maintain the Airport as provided in the Project Application incorporated herein.
4. The Administrator having determined that no space in airport buildings will be required by any civil agency of the United States for the purposes set forth in paragraph 9 of Part III of the Project Application, the provisions of the said paragraph shall be deemed to be of no force or effect.
5. Any misrepresentation or omission of a material fact by the Co-sponsors concerning the Project or the Co-sponsors' authority or ability to carry out the obligations assumed by the Co-sponsors in accepting this Offer shall terminate the obligation of the United States, and it is understood and agreed by the Co-sponsors in accepting this Offer that, if a material fact has been misrepresented or omitted by the Co-sponsors, the Administrator on behalf of the United States may recover all grant payments made.
6. The Administrator reserves the right to amend or withdraw this Offer at any time prior to its acceptance by the Co-sponsors.
7. This Offer shall expire and the United States shall not be obligated to pay any of the allowable costs of the Project unless this Offer has been accepted by the Co-sponsors within 60 days from the above date of Offer or such longer time as may be prescribed by the Administrator in writing.
8. It is hereby understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the Administrator, in tendering this Offer in behalf of the United States, recognizes the existence of a Co-sponsorship Agreement between the City of Modesto and the County of Stanislaus entered into on May 25, 1955, which Agreement is incorporated herein and which is attached to the Grant Agreement for Project No. 9-04-027-503, it being understood that by acceptance of this Offer, each of said Co-sponsors assumes only their respective obligations as provided in said Agreement, and it being further understood and agreed that the Co-Sponsors will not amend, modify, or terminate said Agreement without the prior approval in writing of the Administrator or his duly designated representative.
9. RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO APPROVE AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT PROVIDING FOR PARTICIPATION IN STATE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the State Employees' Retirement Law permits the participation of public agencies in the State Employees' Retirement System, by the execution of a contract making their employees members of said System, and sets forth the procedure by which said public agencies may elect to subject themselves and their employees to amendments to said law, providing for a guaranteed percentage of final compensation for each year of service as "Member", and providing for the portion of compensation to be included in computations under said law; and

WHEREAS, one step in said procedure is the adoption by the legislative

body of the public agency, of a resolution giving notice of its intention to approve an amendment to a contract between said governing board and the Board of Administration of said Retirement System, providing for said participation, which said resolution shall contain a summary of the major provisions of the proposed Retirement System; and

WHEREAS; the following is a summary of the major provisions of the proposed Retirement System:

1. The System is administered by a board of eight members, composed of three members of the System, an official of a bank, an official of a life insurance company, the Director of Finance, a member of the State Personnel Board, and an official of the University of California.
2. Retirement for service is optional upon attainment of age 55 by local firemen and local policemen, and age 60 or age 55 at the election of the Public Agency, by other employees, and completion of twenty years of service for the Public Agency, and is compulsory at age 65 for local firemen and local policemen, and at age 70 for other employees.
3. The monthly retirement allowance payable upon retirement for service is dependent upon such factors as age, sex, salary and years of service. For local firemen and local policemen, retiring at age 55 in paragraph 2, or at a higher age with 20 years of service, the monthly allowance is approximately one-half the average monthly salary during the five years immediately preceding retirement, unless the Public Agency elects to provide prior service benefits at less than the full amount. For other Agency employees, the monthly allowance, upon retirement at age 65 if the Agency elects 60 as the lowest optional service retirement age, is approximately 1/70th of the average monthly salary during the five years immediately preceding retirement, for each year of service after the effective date of participation, plus approximately 1/70th, or less as may be provided in said contract by the Public Agency for its employees, of "final compensation" or of the average monthly salary during the three years immediately preceding the effective date of participation, for each year of service prior to that date. Upon retirement at age 60, if the agency elects 55 as the lowest optional service retirement age, the fraction is approximately 1/60th instead of 1/70th.
4. A minimum service retirement allowance of \$40 per month is guaranteed upon retirement at age 70 with credit for service rendered prior to said effective date, if the Public Agency elects age 60 as the lowest optional service retirement age, or a minimum allowance of \$60 per month upon retirement at age 65 or over with twenty years of service, or upon retirement at age 70 with credit for prior service, if the Public Agency elects age 55 as the lowest optional service retirement age.
5. Retirement for disability, except in the case of local firemen and local policemen disabled from injury arising out of and in the course of employment, is permitted only after ten years of service and upon proof of incapacity for the performance of duty.
6. The monthly retirement allowance payable upon disability retirement, described in preceding item 5, is dependent upon such factors as age, salary and years of service, but generally is equal to 90% of 1/70th, or 1/60th as the case may be, of the average monthly salary during the five years immediately preceding retirement, for each year of service, with a guarantee of 25% of said salary, subject to certain restrictions and modifications.
7. Disability retirement of local firemen and local policemen, in the event of disability arising out of and in the course of employment, is permitted regardless of age and service, the monthly retirement allowance being one-half the average monthly salary during the five years immediately preceding retirement.
8. The benefit payable at death before retirement, except in the case of local firemen and local policemen dying from injury arising out of and in the course of employment, consists of the contributions of the member plus interest, and plus 1/12th of the member's annual salary during the year immediately preceding death, for each year, not exceeding six years, of service as a member of the System. Upon death after retirement, and at the election of the Public Agency, a benefit of \$400 is payable.
9. The monthly allowance payable to the widow and children, at the death of local firemen and local policemen arising out of and in the course of employment, is one-half the average monthly salary during the five years immediately preceding death.
10. The benefit upon separation from service by other cause than death or retirement, is the refund of the member's contributions, with interest. Members having accumulated contributions of at least \$500 upon resignation or discharge, may elect irrevocable, within ninety days to leave contributions in the Retirement Fund, and then upon reaching the lowest optional service retirement age or becoming disabled, to be entitled to receive such retirement allowance as will be provided by them and the Agency's contributions and their credited service, regardless of service rendered.
11. Contributions required of local firemen and local policemen, without credit for prior service, depend upon salary and upon age of entry into the Retirement System, the contributions per \$100 of salary varying from

\$7.63 at entry age 21, to \$14.35 at entry age 35. Contributions of firemen and policemen having credit for prior service depend on salary, entry age, and amount of prior service, the amount of contributions per \$100 being \$16.33 for example, at entry age 54, with 19 years of prior service.

- 12. For other Agency employees, the contributions depend upon salary, sex and age of entry into the Retirement System, the contributions per \$100 of salary varying from \$4.62 at age 20, to \$7.99 at age 64, for men, and from \$5.30 at age 20, to \$9.45 at age 64, for women, all based on the Public Agency's election of age 60 as the low-optional service retirement age. If the Public Agency elects age 55 as the lowest optional service retirement age, the contributions per \$100 of salary vary from \$7.36 at age 20, to \$10.88 at age 59, for men, and from \$8.35 at age 20, to \$12.81 at age 59, for women.
- 13. The Agency is required to contribute the balance of funds necessary to meet the cost of the benefits provided under the Retirement System for the Agency employees. The Agency also is required to pay its proportionate share of the administrative costs of the System.
- 14. Ability of the Retirement System to pay benefits is safeguarded by a provision authorizing the Board of Administration to revise contributions of both employees and the Agency, in the light of experience under the System.

 - (b) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the terms of this Offer, and the Federal Airport Act and the Regulations promulgated thereunder by the administrator in effect on the date of this Offer, which Act and Regulations are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, and
 - (c) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the property map incorporated herein as it may be revised or modified with the approval of the Administrator or his duly authorized representatives.

7. This Offer shall expire and the United States shall not be obligated to pay any of the allowable costs of the Project unless this offer has been accepted by the Co-sponsors within 60 days from the above date of Offer or such longer time as may be prescribed by the Administrator in writing.
8. It is hereby understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the Administrator, in tendering this Offer in behalf of the United States, recognizes the existence of a Co-sponsorship Agreement between the City of Modesto and the County of Stanislaus entered into on May 25, 1955, which Agreement is incorporated herein and which is attached to the Grant Agreement for Project No. 9-04-027-503, it being understood that by acceptance of this Offer, each of said Co-sponsors assumes only their respective obligations as provided in said Agreement, and it being further understood and agreed that the Co-sponsors will not amend, modify, or terminate said Agreement without the prior approval in writing of the Administrator or his duly designated representative.
9. It is hereby understood and agreed by and between the parties hereto that the Co-sponsors will acquire property interests satisfactory to the Administrator in land parcels 4, 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15 as shown on Exhibit 'A'; and that the United States will not make nor be obligated to make any payments involving any of the land included in this project until the Co-sponsors have submitted evidence that they have acquired satisfactory title in and to said land, or any portion thereof for which Grant Payment is sought, subject to no liens, encumbrances, reservations or exception which in the opinion of the Administrator would create an undue risk of interference with the accomplishment of the project or the use and operation of the airport.

The Co-sponsors' acceptance of this Offer and ratification and adoption of the Project Application incorporated herein shall be evidenced by execution of this instrument by the City of Modesto, California and the County of Stanislaus, California, as Co-sponsors, as hereinafter provided, and said Offer and acceptance shall comprise a Grant Agreement as provided by the Federal Airport Act, constituting the obligations and rights of the United States, on the one part, and the City of Modesto and County of Stanislaus, jointly and severally, on the other part, with respect to the accomplishment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the Airport. AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT BETWEEN THE BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION STATE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MODESTO

The Board of Administration, State Employees' Retirement System, and the City Council of the City of Modesto, hereinafter referred to as Agency, having entered into a contract under date of July 27, 1946, effective August 1, 1946, which provides for the participation of said Agency in said Retirement System, and said Contract being based on the Retirement Law exclusive of amendments thereto which changed benefits and ages of retirement, said Board of Administration and said City Council hereby agree as follows:

1. Paragraphs 4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11 and 12 shall be and are hereby stricken from said Contract.
2. The following paragraphs shall be and are hereby added to said Contract:
 4. Age 60 shall be the normal age for retirement for service, of persons who are miscellaneous members because of employment by Public Agency, that is, members other than Local Firemen, Local Policemen or County Peace Officers, and one-sixtieth shall be the fraction of final compensation, as defined in said Retirement Law, to be provided for each year of service as a member upon retirement at age 60, and the provisions of Section 21251.1 of said Retirement Law, providing for a guaranteed percentage of said final compensation, shall apply.
 5. Prior service benefits to miscellaneous members employed by Public Agency, that is, members other than Local Firemen, Local Policemen, or County Peace Officers upon retirement for service, shall be allowed only as a percentage of the average salary specified in Section 21253 of said Retirement Law, for each year of such service, and said percentage shall be 100 per cent of the percentage determined under said Section for the age at retirement
 6. Age 55 shall be the minimum age for retirement for service, of persons who are members because of employment by Public Agency as Local Firemen, Local Policemen or County Peace Officers and the provisions of Section 21252.4 of the State Employees' Retirement Law, providing for a guaranteed percentage of final compensation for each year of current service as a member, shall apply to such members.
 7. Benefits on account of prior service, that is, service credited hereunder as rendered to Public Agency prior to the effective date of participation, to respective persons who are members because of employment by Public Agency as Local Firemen, Local Policemen or County Peace Officers, shall be allowed only as a percentage of the average salary specified in said Retirement Law, for each year of such service, and said percentage shall be 100 per cent of the fraction of final compensation, as defined in the State Employees' Retirement Law, for each year of service rendered after said date, as determined for said respective members under said law, for retirement for service at age 55, or upon qualification for service retirement at a higher age.

If a member retires for service before attaining age 55, his prior service pension shall be reduced to that amount which the value of the pension as deferred to age 55 will purchase at the actual age of retirement.

8. The provisions of Section 21258b of the State Employees' Retirement Law, guaranteeing a minimum retirement allowance under certain conditions shall apply to persons who are members because of employment by Public Agency.
9. The provisions of Section 21367.51 of the State Employees' Retirement Law, providing a \$400 death benefit after retirement shall apply to persons who are members because of employment by Public Agency.
10. The provisions of Section 20025 of the State Employees' Retirement Law, providing that there shall be no maximum limitation in the compensation which shall be included in computations under the Retirement Law, shall apply to employees of Public Agency who become members of said Retirement System.
11. The provisions of Section 20024.01 of the State Employees' Retirement Law, which provide that "final compensation" shall mean the highest average annual compensation earnable by a member during any period of three consecutive years during his membership in the System, SHALL APPLY to employees of Public Agency who become members of said Retirement System.

The provisions of Section 20952.5 of the State Employees' Retirement Law, which provides age 50 as the minimum voluntary retirement age for Local Firemen and Local Policemen SHALL APPLY to employees of Public Agency who become members of the Retirement System as Local Firemen or Local Policemen.

Public Agency shall contribute to said Retirement System as follows:

- a. The sum of \$32,012.35 per annum, or more frequent installments as Board shall require, for the period of years stated in said Contract, less the time elapsed from the date of participation to the effective date hereof.
- b. 5.024 per cent of total salaries paid by Public Agency each month to its employees who are members of said Retirement System, provided that only salary earned as members of said System shall be included in said total salaries, and the employees who are members of said System shall include employees who are members upon the effective date hereof and employees who become members thereafter.
- c. A reasonable amount per annum, as fixed by Board, to cover the costs of administering said System as it affects the employees of Public Agency, not including the costs of special valuations or of the periodical investigation and valuation required by law, provided that said amount shall be determined on the basis of the number of employees of Public Agency who are members on July 1st of the respective fiscal years.
- d. A reasonable amount as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment from time to time as the occasions arise, to cover the costs of special valuations on account of employees of Public Agency, and the costs of the periodical investigation into the experience under said Retirement System, as it affects said employees, and the valuation of the assets and liabilities of said System on account of said employees.

Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be subject to adjustment by the Board of Administration on account of amendments to the State Employees' Retirement Law, and on account of experience under the Retirement System, as determined by the periodical investigation, valuation and determination provided for by said Retirement Law.

14. Contributions required of Public Agency under the paragraph immediately preceding, and contributions required of Public Agency's employees who are members of said System, shall be paid by Public Agency to the State Employees' Retirement System within thirty days after the end of the month or longer period to which said contributions refer. If more or less than the correct amount of contributions required of Public Agency or its employees is paid for any period, proper adjustment shall be made in connection with subsequent remittances of Public Agency to the Board, to rectify the errors; or such adjustments on account of errors made in contributions required of employees, may be made by direct cash payments between the employee in connection with whom the error was made, and Board. Payments of Public Agency to Board may be made in the form of warrants, bank checks, bank drafts, certified checks, money orders, or cash.
3. Benefits, including retirement allowances, prior to the effective date of this amendment, shall not be affected by this amendment, unless otherwise provided herein.
4. This amendment shall be attached to said Contract and shall be effective as of July 1, 1956





SECTION 1

STANDARDS AND APPROVAL:

- (a) The City Engineer or his authorized assistants shall administer or perform the inspections of specified improvement work to determine conformance with these standards and specifications.
- (b) The term "Standard Specifications" shall mean the standard specifications of the State of California, Department of Public Works, dated August, 1954.
- (c) Subdividers are advised to have their representatives contact the City Engineer before construction is started in order to discuss the requirements of the standards and have a thorough understanding of the schedule of inspections and the individual requirements of the subdivision improvements.
- (d) Plans and profiles of the proposed improvements shall be submitted on tracing paper or tracing cloth on 18" x 26" size sheets and/or standard Plate A, plan-profile not more than 36" in length, to the City Engineer prior to the commencement of any such improvements and to a scale adequate to portray the data for which approval is required.
- Upon securing approval two prints shall be provided prior to construction. Upon completion of improvements, corrections, if any, shall be made and the tracings shall be filed with the City Engineer.
- (e) The subdivider shall request inspections twenty-four hours in advance of the time such inspections are required as hereinafter set forth for each type of improvement. The cost of these inspections shall be based on the actual cost incurred by the City and shall be paid by the subdivider upon completion of the improvements.
- (f) All work rejected by the City Engineer shall be remedied, or removed and replaced by the subdivider. Any work done beyond the lines and grades as shown on the plans approved by the City Engineer may be ordered removed at the subdivider's expense.
- (g) The City Engineer or his authorized representative shall, at all times, have access to the work during construction, and shall be furnished with every reasonable facility for ascertaining the materials used and employed, and the workmanship, are in accordance with the requirements and intentions of these specifications. Work done and material furnished shall be subject to his inspection and approval. Materials found unsuitable may be rejected and must be removed from the project.
- (h) The subdivider shall submit for the approval of the City Engineer the plan and profile of the proposed installation of sanitary sewers and storm drainage facilities. Plans showing location and sizes of all underground utilities other than sanitary sewers and storm drainage facilities shall be submitted by the utility company for approval of the City Engineer before their installation.

Standard Specifications (Cont'd)

(i) All underground utilities excepting gas service connections shall be constructed prior to surfacing of streets, service roads, alleys, and highways. Gas service connections which were made after the completion of the surfacing shall be completed using jacking methods wherever possible so as to limit the size of the street cut. If a deposit of money with the utility company is necessary for the company to proceed with an installation before street work is commenced, the subdivider shall be responsible for the making of such deposit.

(j) Water mains, gas mains, sanitary sewers and all other utilities shall be located in alleys insofar as is practicable. The sewer lines shall be located on the center line, water and gas mains shall be located five feet off the alley center line. The power and telephone facilities shall be located near the edge of alleys where possible.

SECTION II

STREET IMPROVEMENTS:

(a) All streets shall be graded and paved to the cross sections as shown on typical cross section plans contained in these specifications and to the grades as approved by the City Engineer. The subdivider shall improve all existing streets bordering the subdivision to the center lines of such streets, in no case shall he be required to provide more than twenty feet (20'), measured from the face of the curb of such street surfacing. Whenever an oiled surface exists on these streets it shall be removed and replaced with the type of surfacing specified herein. If surfacing on such an existing street is not at the proper grade, subdivider shall deposit with the City Clerk the cost of performing such surfacing. Whenever such street shall be constructed to proper grade, City shall use such deposit to construct subdivider's share. As an interim improvement, City shall oil the unimproved area at time of improvement of subdivision.

(b) The minimum grades of all streets shall be 0.20%. The streets shall be designed so that storm water can be collected at intersections wherever possible.

(c) Subgrade - The subdivider shall prepare the subgrade of streets in accordance with the provisions of Section 15, for Class "A" subgrade, of Standard Specifications.

(d) Base - The prepared subgrade shall be covered with untreated rock base material in accordance with Section 16 of Standard Specifications. The aggregate shall conform to the grading as specified for 1½" maximum aggregate in accordance with Section 16 of the Standard Specifications. The prepared untreated base material shall receive a penetration treatment of SC-2 at the rate of approximately 0.25 gallons per square yard in accordance with Section 22 of Standard Specifications. The minimum thickness of the base measured after compaction shall be as follows:

1. On major streets the thickness shall be 6".
2. On all secondary streets, where required by the City Engineer, the thickness shall be 6".
3. On all other streets the thickness shall be 4".

(e) Surfacing - The surfacing shall conform to the requirements of Section 20 of the Standard Specifications for Type "B" Plant-mixed surfacing and shall have a minimum thickness of 2" after compaction; or the surfacing shall conform to the requirements of Section 19 of Standard Specifications for Road-mixed surfacing and shall have a minimum thickness of 3" after compaction. When Road-Mixed surfacing is used, a medium fine seal-coat shall be applied conforming to Section 23 of Standard Specifications. The paving asphalt for Plant-Mixed surfacing

Standard Specifications (Cont'd)

shall have a penetration of 120-150, and shall be furnished and applied to conform with the provisions of Section 54 of Standard Specifications.

(f) Finishing of the roadway shall be done in accordance with Section 53 of Standard Specifications, and shall be approved by the City Engineer.

(g) Subdivider shall request and obtain inspection for each of the following steps of street construction:

1. Subgrade preparation
2. Base preparation
3. Base penetration treatment
4. Laying of Surface
5. Finishing surface

SECTION III

ALLEY IMPROVEMENTS:

(a) Residential Alleys.

1. The minimum grade for residential alleys shall be 0.20% and they shall be designed so that the storm water will drain towards the street.
2. Subgrade - Subgrade shall be prepared to conform with the requirements of Class "A" subgrade in Section 15 of Standard Specifications.
3. Surfacing - The surfacing shall be an armor coat and shall conform to the requirements of Section 24 of the Standard Specifications, except that paragraph (g), first application, be omitted.
4. The finished surface shall have a 2" crown and shall conform to the grades and cross sections as shown on the approved plans.
5. The subdivider shall request and obtain inspections for each of the following steps of residential alley construction:
 - a. Subgrade preparation
 - b. Penetration treatment
 - c. Preparation and laying of surface

(b) Commercial Alleys.

1. Subgrade - Subgrade shall be prepared to conform with the requirements of Class "A" subgrade in Section 15 of Standard Specifications.
2. Concrete Alley Gutter - The concrete alley gutter shall be constructed in accordance with the standard details contained in these specifications and to the lines and grades as shown on the approved plans and shall conform to Section IV of these specifications.

Standard Specifications (Cont'd)

3. Base - The prepared subgrade shall be covered with 6" of untreated rock base material in accordance with Section 16 of Standard Specifications. The combined aggregate shall conform to the grading as specified for $1\frac{1}{2}$ " maximum aggregate in accordance with Section 16 of the Standard Specifications. The prepared untreated rock base material shall receive a penetration treatment of SG-2 at the rate of approximately 0.25 gallons per square yard in accordance with Section 22 of the Standard Specifications.
4. Surfacing - The surfacing shall be a minimum thickness of 2" after compaction and shall conform to the requirements of Section 20 of the Standard Specifications for Type "B" Plant-Mixed surfacing. The paving asphalt shall have a penetration of 120-150 and shall be furnished and applied to conform with the provisions of Section 54 of the Standard Specifications.
5. The finished surface shall conform to the lines and grades as shown on the approved plans and shall conform to the standard details contained in these specifications.
6. The subdivider shall request and obtain inspection for each of the following steps of commercial alley construction:
 - a. Subgrade preparation and forms before pouring of concrete
 - b. During pouring of concrete
 - c. Base preparation
 - d. Base penetration treatment
 - e. Laying of surface
 - f. Finished surface and gutter

SECTION IV

CONCRETE CURB, GUTTER AND SIDEWALK:

(a) All curbs, gutters and sidewalks shall be constructed in accordance with the standard details contained in these specifications and to the lines and grades as shown on the approved plans, and in accordance with Section 36 of Standard Specifications with the following exceptions:

1. Expansion joints shall be $1/4$ " wide and shall be constructed at 30' intervals, and as shown in the standard details contained in these specifications.
2. All curbs, gutters and sidewalks shall be constructed with Class "B" concrete (Five sacks of cement per cubic yard) in accordance with Section 26, Standard Specifications. In no case shall the slump be over 3", and the concrete shall have a minimum compressive strength of 2500 pounds per square inch. at 28 days.
3. Sidewalks, when required against the property line, shall be constructed one inch (1") from said property lines to provide space for lot corner stakes.
4. When ready-mixed concrete is used, a delivery ticket for each load shall be supplied the City Engineer accompanied by either a bonded weighmaster's certificate or seal thereon specifying the weight and proportions of the concrete delivered.

5. Subdividers shall request and obtain inspections for each of the following steps of curb, gutter and sidewalk construction:
- a. Forms and subgrade before pouring of concrete
 - b. During pouring of concrete
 - c. Completed curb, gutter and sidewalk.

SECTION V

SANITARY SEWERS:

(a) Sanitary sewer laterals shall be constructed to the lines, grades and sizes and connected to existing sewers as shown on the approved plan. Where future lines are to be connected, pipe of the proper size will be stubbed out from the manhole and plugged.

(b) Slope - All new sanitary sewer lines shall have a minimum invert grade of not less than four tenths (0.40%) per cent for a 6" sewer line. When larger lines are installed the velocity shall be not less than two (2) feet per second when the sewer is full or half full. The value of "n" when Manning's formula is used shall be .013.

(c) Cover - All new sanitary sewer lines shall have a minimum of three feet of cover measuring from the top of the pipe to the finished surface. The sewer line shall be so located that the house service shall be not less than two (2) feet below the top of the curb at the curb line.

(d) Manholes - A standard manhole structure shall be constructed at all changes in vertical or horizontal alignment and at least four hundred (400) feet on straight runs of pipe. In addition there shall be a standard manhole structure constructed at all pipe intersections. The manhole structures shall be constructed as shown on the details contained herein. All deadends shall have a manhole structure or a lamphole subject to the approval of the City Engineer.

(e) Excavation - The subdivider shall perform all excavation necessary or required to construct all pipe lines and structures herein specified. Excavation shall include the removal and disposal of all materials of whatever nature encountered. All trenches shall be excavated in open cut, following neat, parallel lines equidistant from the center line. No tunneling or jacking will be permitted without written permission from the Engineer except as noted in these Specifications. Trench shall be of sufficient width to provide clearance beside the pipe for bracing and support, for pumpage, and for draining trenches. Maximum width of the trench at the level of the top of the pipe to be laid therein shall not exceed the outside diameter of the pipe barrel plus sixteen (16) inches. Said width of trench shall be kept as small as practicable while providing sufficient working space for jointing pipe and compacting backfill. At no time shall there be more than 1000 linear feet of the trench opened, including the section opened ahead for pipe laying and the section behind which is not completely backfilled.

If any of the trench bottom is in material too hard to permit proper bedding of the pipe, excavation must be carried to a depth at least four (4) inches below the grade of the bottom of the pipe, and this over-excavation shall then be brought to grade with approved material compacted in place. Should the trench bottom at any location be of material which will not afford sufficient sound foundation, it shall be excavated to such depth as directed by the Engineer and re-filled to grade with approved materials compacted in place.

Standard Specifications (Cont'd)

Excess and/or rejected material shall be disposed of by the subdivider.

(f) Shoring, Bracing and Sheeting - The subdivider shall furnish, install and maintain such shoring, bracing and sheeting as required to conform to the rules of the California Industrial Accident Commission to support sides of the trench and prevent movement which could cause injury to any person or structure. Any damage resulting from a lack of adequate shoring, bracing or sheeting shall be repaired at the subdivider's expense.

(g) Pipe - The pipe used shall be extra strength vitrified clay pipe conforming to A.S.T.M. specifications C-200-44T except that no glazed pipe will be permitted. The type of pipe used shall be as specified by the City Engineer and as shown on the approved plans.

(h) The pipe shall be laid in such a manner that it shall have a firm and uniform bearing over its entire length and shall be in perfect conformity with the lines and grades as shown on the approved plans.

(i) The joint shall be made with Kalktite #340 as manufactured by the Presstite Engineering Company, or with Brant rings or equal.

(j) Wherever the lateral is located in the street, the service connections shall be constructed to the back of the sidewalk so that no excavation of completed paved surfaces will be necessary.

(k) Backfilling - After the sewers and appurtenances have been properly constructed and inspected and the joints have set, the trench shall be backfilled from the subgrade to a height one (1) foot above the top of the pipe in horizontal layers not exceeding six (6) inches in depth before compaction. Each layer shall be moistened as directed by the Engineer and thoroughly tamped, or otherwise compacted until the relative compaction is not less than ninety (90) per cent as determined by the Impact or Field Method Compaction Test of the Division of Highways of the State of California. Should the subdivider elect to furnish sandy or granular material for backfill, the six (6) inch layer construction may be eliminated and compaction obtained by ponding. Ponding will not be permitted when the backfill material will not compact to a relative compaction of 90% by such methods. Backfill material shall be brought up evenly on both sides of the pipe. The remaining portion of the backfill shall be completed by either of the two methods hereinafter described:

1. Flooding - Backfill material shall be deposited in horizontal layers not exceeding four (4) feet in thickness and flooded until water will stand on the surface for five (5) minutes. The succeeding layer of material may then be placed and flooded as above. Adequate dikes shall be constructed to retain the water. Backfilling shall continue in this manner to within one (1) foot of the surface of the surrounding ground. The last foot shall be placed in layers not exceeding six (6) inches in thickness and compacted by rolling with trench roller with a compression of not less than 200 pounds per linear inch on the compacting wheel, or as directed by the Engineer.

2. Jetting - The backfill material shall be placed in layers not to exceed six (6) feet in thickness and continued up to a point one (1) foot below the ground surface, leveled and settled by water jetting in the following manner. Jets shall be placed at intervals not to exceed six (6) feet and closer if necessary to saturate and collapse the fill. Jets shall be long enough to reach the full depth of the layer. Structures shall be in place prior to placing backfill and jetting shall be a continuous operation from structure to structure, starting at the lowest elevation and continuing up grade.

Standard Specifications (Cont'd)

After jetting, dry fill material shall be used to complete the backfill to the required elevation as required in the previous paragraph.

Wherever it is necessary to cross an existing irrigation pipe, whether the pipe is cut through and replaced or tunneled underneath, the backfill shall be made by use of a pneumatic tamper. The entire area under the irrigation pipe, two feet on either side and six inches on top of the pipe shall be tamped.

(l) Restoring Surface - Where the work has required the cutting of the pavement to a point which is less than six feet from the edge of the pavement, the subdivider shall remove and replace the remaining strip in addition to the portion removed by the trench work. In cases where a pavement or oiled surface more than two inches in thickness has been cut, the restored surface must be one inch thicker than the original pavement; however, if the entire width of any pavement is required to be replaced by the above condition, the thickness of the new pavement shall equal the thickness of the original pavement. Prior to any repaving, all uneven edges of the remaining pavement shall be trimmed or cut in true and even lines parallel to and at right angles to the sewer line.

(m) Tests - When completed, tests shall be made as prescribed by the City Engineer.

SECTION VI

STORM DRAINAGE

(a) The subdivider shall install curb inlets conforming to City of Modesto standards at all low points in gutters or elsewhere, as shown on approved plans, and as needed to collect storm waters and provide street drainage.

(b) Where storm trunk sewers are available such inlets shall be connected thereto with storm laterals of sizes approved by the City Engineer. Where no storm trunk sewer is available, the subdivider shall provide horizontal drains or dry wells as shown on standard details contained in these specifications. These "horizontal drains" or "dry wells" shall, insofar as practical, be constructed under the sidewalks. Wherever necessary because of a high water table "horizontal drains" or a combination of "horizontal drains" and "dry wells" shall be constructed as directed by the City Engineer. When such "horizontal drains" are required there shall be 330 lineal feet of "drain" per acre of street area.

(c) Run-off - Maximum run-off in connection with subdivision development shall be computed using the rational method and the following assumed factors:

$$Q = ACI$$

"Q" represents the quantity of run-off and is used as the design basis of the storm drain system.

"A" represents the total upstream area that drains into the proposed catch basins or curb inlets expressed in acres.

"C" represents the coefficient of run-off. Values of "C" shall be as stated below.

Residential Areas = 0.30

Business, Industrial
and Commercial Areas = 0.80

"I" represents the intensity of rainfall in inches per hour taken from the five year frequency curve as shown on the Rainfall

Intensity-Frequency Curves in Modesto, California from data supplied by the U.S. Weather Bureau. The time of concentration shall be as determined by use of an average velocity of one foot per second in the gutter with the addition of twenty (20) minutes as the time from the furthest point of concentration in a lot to the gutter.

(d) Size - The storm sewer drains shall be a minimum of twelve (12) inches in diameter. The actual size shall be determined by the peak run-off value as computed in (c) of these specifications. The proposed slope shall be designed with a minimum velocity of two feet per second, two and a half feet per second being desirable, when flowing full and assuming an "n" value of 0.013 for concrete pipe using Manning's formula.

(e) Storm sewers shall conform to Sections 45,46, or 47 of Standard Specifications.

(f) Paragraphs e, f, h, k, l and m of Section V shall apply to this Section.

SECTION VII

MONUMENTS

(a) Monuments required by the City of Modesto Subdivision Regulation to be set at specified points on subdivision boundaries and in streets and alleys, shall consist of galvanized iron pipe not less than 3/4 inch inside diameter, thirty-six inches long, set with the top thereof one foot below finished grade and with the center of the top at the exact point monumented.

(b) Monuments required to be set at lot corners shall consist of galvanized iron pipe not less than 1/2 inch in inside diameter or 1/2 inch diameter metal rod not less than thirty-six inches long, set with the top thereof one foot below finished grade and with the center of the top at the exact point monumented.







(B) Beginning at a point on the northerly curb line of Downey Avenue at its intersection with the easterly property line of McHenry Avenue and continuing easterly along said curb line a distance of one hundred ~~twenty~~-two (122') feet

SECTION 2. The Traffic Engineer is hereby directed to cause the above described area to be marked and posted in accordance with the provisions of this resolution and the applicable laws of the City of Modesto.



A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING SALARY SCHEDULES AND
FIXING THE COMPENSATION FOR CLASSES OF POSITIONS
IN THE CITY SERVICE

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Modesto as follows:

SECTION 1. Salary Ranges and Rates. The salary rates, salary ranges and salary steps as set forth in "Exhibit A", entitled, "Schedule of Salary Ranges in the City Service", which is attached thereto and hereby made a part hereof, are hereby established.

SECTION 2. Salaries for Classes of Positions. The Salary ranges and rates for the classes of positions established by the Position Classification Plan, as set forth in "Exhibit B" entitled, "Salary Ranges and Rates for Classes of Positions in the City Service", which is attached hereto and hereby made a part hereof, are hereby established.

SECTION 3. Use of Classes. The designated classes of positions may be used in any organizational unit of the City deemed proper by the City Manager.

SECTION 4. Salary Period. The salaries hereby established are on a monthly basis, unless otherwise designated.

SECTION 5. Positions. The Council authorizes and directs the City Manager, within the limits of fund budgeted therefor, to appoint and retain employees in such number, in such classes, and at such salaries in each department as may be necessary properly to operate the department under the Charter, ordinances and resolutions adopted by the Council.

SECTION 6. Appointments and Salaries. The City Manager is hereby authorized to appoint, in accordance with applicable provisions of the Personnel Ordinance and Personnel Rules and within the limits of funds budgeted therefor, any person to a position in a class for which he is the appointing authority and for which the salary is herein provided, to designate the definite salary rate or salary step at which such person is appointed, and the salary so designated is hereby fixed as the salary of such employee for the position until changed in accordance with the Personnel Rules.

SECTION 7. Special Salary Rates. The City Manager is further authorized, subject to budgetary appropriation control by the Council, to fix the salary range or rate for part-time or special positions in the Unclassified Service for which he is the appointing authority and which are not designated herein. The City Manager is further authorized to approve increases in the salaries of employees in the class of Patrolman to the equivalent step in any of the next three higher ranges above the range established for the class, as compensation for special assignment by the Chief of Police.

SECTION 8. Part-Time Employment. Employees appointed to any of the positions referred to herein who, with the approval of the City Manager, regularly work less hours per week than established for their class by Rule 13.1 of the Personnel Rules, shall be paid in approximate proportion to the time worked.

SECTION 9. Title of Resolution. This resolution shall be known as "The Salary Resolution" and shall be referred to as such.

SECTION 10. Effective Date. The schedules of salary rates and ranges, and the compensation fixed for classes of positions by this resolution shall be effective July 1, 1956.

SECTION 11. Repeal Resolution No. 55-348, and all amendments thereto, and all resolutions or portions of resolutions in conflict herewith, are hereby rescinded.

4. That Section 10-2.1804 be amended to delete the words, "Parking Authority".

5. That Section 10-2.1904 (d) be added to read as follows: "Where a zone boundary line divides a lot in a single ownership at the time of the effective date of this Chapter, the Board of Zoning Adjustment may permit a use authorized on either portion of such lot to extend not more than seventy-five (75) feet into the other portion of the lot."

Under direction, to provide nursing services in the schools; to do field work related to school nursing; to assist at clinics; to assist in public health follow-up; and to do related work as required.

Typical Tasks

Prepares and assembles equipment and supplies and assists physicians in the conduct of physical examinations and immunizations; follows up irregular conditions found by physician with students, teachers, and parents; makes health inspections of students and assists in a program of health education in the schools; keeps student health records; visits homes to investigate health problems, to furnish advice and guidance, and to give family health supervision in nursing care and in the prevention of disease; provides emergency first aid service in schools and arranges with family for care of more seriously injured or ill students; follows up on cases of vision or hearing deficiencies with students and their families; assists in the prevention and control of communicable diseases through investigation, instruction in preventative measures, immunization programs, and case follow-up; participates in community health conferences; keeps records and prepares reports.

Grade Standards

For purposes of salary determination, this class is divided into two grades which are distinguished from one another on the following basis:

Grade I - includes positions filled by persons who possess a valid state license as a registered nurse and who are in the process of completing courses required for a Health and Development Credential.

Grade II - includes positions filled by persons who have completed all requirements for a Health and Development Credential or a Public Health Nurse certificate.

Employment Standards

Any combination of training and experience equivalent to completion of an accredited course in nursing.

Possession of a valid State license as a registered nurse for
Grade I

Possession of a Health and Development Credential or a Public
Health Nurse certificate for Grade II

Desirable Qualifications

Knowledge of the theory, techniques, and practices of nursing; ability to keep accurate health records; ability to establish and maintain effectual relationships with physicians, students, other staff members, and the general public.

Under general supervision, on an assigned shift, to receive police telephone and radio messages and to transmit appropriate messages to police personnel by voice radio; to assist in the processing and maintenance of police records; to perform a variety of clerical work; and to do related work as required.

Typical Tasks

Receives telephone calls and other messages requiring police action and transmits orders to appropriate law enforcement personnel; uses standard operating procedure in sending and receiving radio telephone messages; monitors calls; receives emergency calls and dispatches appropriate unit to handle emergency; receives public at information counter and supplies necessary information; assists in the daily processing of a wide variety of police reports and records; receives incident, daily and other reports from police personnel, checks for completeness as to form, checks against current records, sets up necessary file record cards, prepares necessary additional copies for other law enforcement agencies, and sends to Police Chief or other appropriate departmental personnel for review; receives, records, and preserves evidence turned in by departmental personnel; keeps lost and found property file; compiles accident reports; makes first reports on complaints; operates a teletype machine and files teletype messages; searches records to find information to assist in investigations or in dispatches; issues permits and licenses; does general typing and filing; attends regular departmental training sessions.

Employment Standards

Any combination of training and experience equivalent to completion of the twelfth grade.

Ability to qualify for a Third Class Radio Telephone Operator's license issued by the Federal Communications Commission.

Desirable Qualifications

Knowledge of office practices and procedures, office appliances and of filing systems; knowledge of the rules and regulations of the Federal Communications Commission, covering the operation of radio transmitters and receivers in law enforcement work; ability to perform a variety of clerical work quickly and accurately; ability to type from clear copy accurately at a rate of not less than twenty-five words per minute; ability to speak clearly and concisely; ability to think clearly and act quickly in emergencies.

Plans, assigns and directs the work of police personnel assigned to his unit; assumes specific responsibility for morale and discipline within his unit and generally throughout the department; receives and reads or prepares and transmits communications, instructions and policy to officers; receives, originates and signs correspondence; receives complaints or reports of emergencies, determines need for police action and directs and assists subordinates in handling problems; supervises and inspects the work of officers in the field; reviews work of officers; supervises and assists in the training of police department personnel; gives general direction to the reserve police organization; cooperates with other agencies and police officers in law enforcement matters; meets with other public agencies to discuss problems of mutual interest; meets with civic groups to explain law enforcement problems in the City and to enlist public support for departmental activities; when designated by the Chief, assumes command responsibility for entire department.

Employment Standards

Any combination of training and experience equivalent to completion of the twelfth grade, supplemented by formal training courses in police science and administration, and at least six years of experience as a police officer, including three years as a sergeant or higher.

Desirable Qualifications

Knowledge of criminal law and investigation and crime prevention methods; knowledge of police administration; knowledge of traffic enforcement and education; knowledge of modern methods of identification and of keeping police records; knowledge of the rules of evidence and of the laws governing the custody of persons; familiarity with traffic engineering; ability to analyze law enforcement problems and adopt an effective course of action; ability to plan, assign and coordinate and review the work of a number of subordinate police officers; ability to plan and conduct a comprehensive training program; ability to prepare accurate and comprehensive reports; ability to establish and maintain effective public relations.

Definition

Under direction, to perform a variety of clerical work; to take shorthand notes from dictation and transcribe them on a typewriter; to do general typing; and to do related work as required.

Takes shorthand notes from dictation and transcribes them; composes letters from marginal notes or oral or written instructions; types letters, reports, records, work orders, payrolls, vouchers, encumbrances, and requisitions involving the use of some independent judgment; answers inquiries about departmental standards and procedures; arranges committee meetings; records the sense of meetings for the minutes; posts and makes entries in books of account or other records; maintains mailing lists, files, and card indexes; extends and computes figures for requisitions and other forms; cares for supplies; keeps time reports of employees and prepares payroll and work reports; proofreads material; reads and routes mail; cut stencils; serves as receptionist; accepts payments; prepares receipts and deposit slips; operates duplicating equipment; compiles, computes, types, and mimeographs reports; prepares legal documents following known statutory procedures rather than specific directions; interviews applicants for licenses and issues permits.

Grade Standards

For purposes of salary determination, this class is divided into two grades which are distinguished as follows:

Stenographer-Clerk - includes positions filled by persons who have at least one year of stenographic or clerical experience, in addition to training and experience equivalent to the completion of the twelfth grade.

Jr. Stenographer-Clerk - includes positions filled by persons who meet all requirements for Stenographer-Clerk, except the one-year experience requirement.

Employment Standards

Any combination of training and experience equivalent to completion of the twelfth grade and one year stenographic and clerical work.

Desirable Qualifications

Knowledge of business letter writing and forms; knowledge of modern office methods, procedures, and appliances; knowledge of simple legal procedures and forms; ability to take dictation at a speed of not less than 90 words a minute and accurately transcribe it at a speed of not less than 25 words a minute; ability to type accurately from clear copy at a speed of not less than 45 net words a minute; ability to spell and to use good English; ability to perform a variety of clerical work; ability to make accurate comparisons

and computations; ability in establishing and maintaining indexes and files; ability to understand and carry out oral and written directions; ability to win the respect and friendship of the public, to understand their questions, and to give clear and satisfactory explanations; ability to get along well with fellow-employees; aptitude and liking for office work.

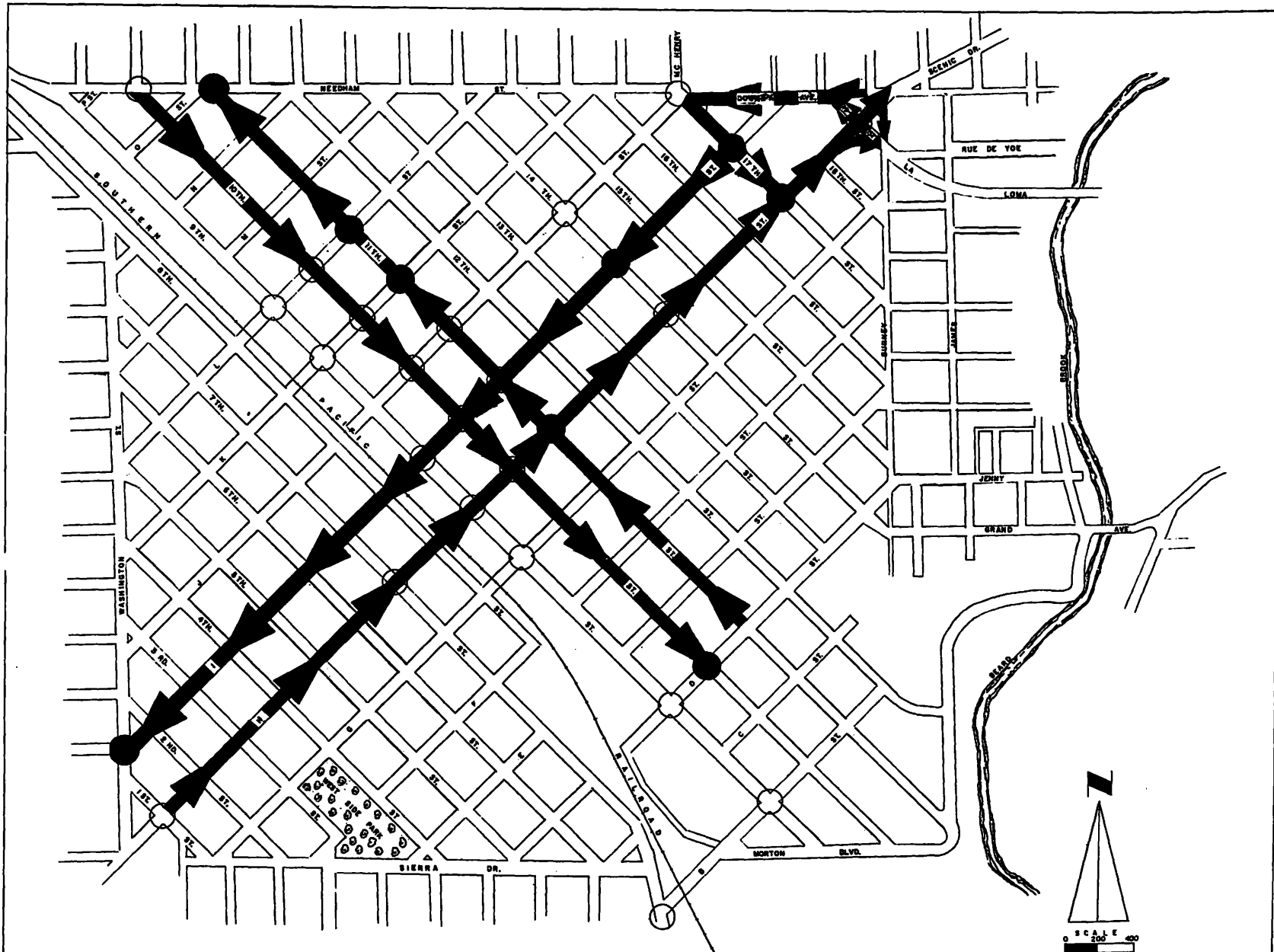

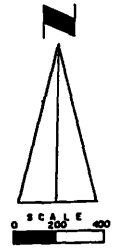

BOND MEASURE NO. 2 (COURT HOUSE) BY THE CITIZENS
OF THE CITY OF MODESTO AT THE COMING ELECTION

WHEREAS, the building erected by the County of Stanislaus about 1874 for its offices and Courts and which is now known as the Old Court House is at this time used in its entirety by the three departments of the Superior Court and two of the Municipal Court, and no further accommodations are available for any additional Courts which may be required by further increase in population and legal business,

AND WHEREAS, because of its age and its lack of adequate heating, cooling, ventilating, elevator, and other facilities, it has become obsolete, and because of the manner of construction and the materials used, a dangerous fire hazard exists, and there is also constant danger from falling plaster and heavy cornices within the building, and most of the building, both inside and outside, is in a condition of dilapidation and disrepair because for many years it has been considered economically unsound to expend any more upon it than was absolutely necessary for its temporary use until a new building could be constructed,

AND WHEREAS, these conditions cause great inconvenience, discomfort, and danger to the many citizens of our County who are required by law to be and remain in attendance at these Courts as Jurors, witnesses and otherwise,

AND WHEREAS, the age, type of construction and materials are such that these defects and dangers can be obviated, if at all, only by extensive alteration and reconstruction at a cost which could not be justified by any possible results, and would be economically unsound and wasteful,

AND WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Stanislaus County has considered these matters and has concluded that such alteration and reconstruction are impractical and wasteful, and that the construction of a new building will result in ultimate savings to the taxpayers, and that it should not be delayed until the funds can be provided from general tax levies, and is therefore submitting to the voters at the

coming general election the matter of a bond issue to finance immediate construction,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Modesto that it recommends that said bond issue be approved by the voters at the coming election in order to provide the necessary funds for the immediate construction of a new building for the Courts of Stanislaus County,





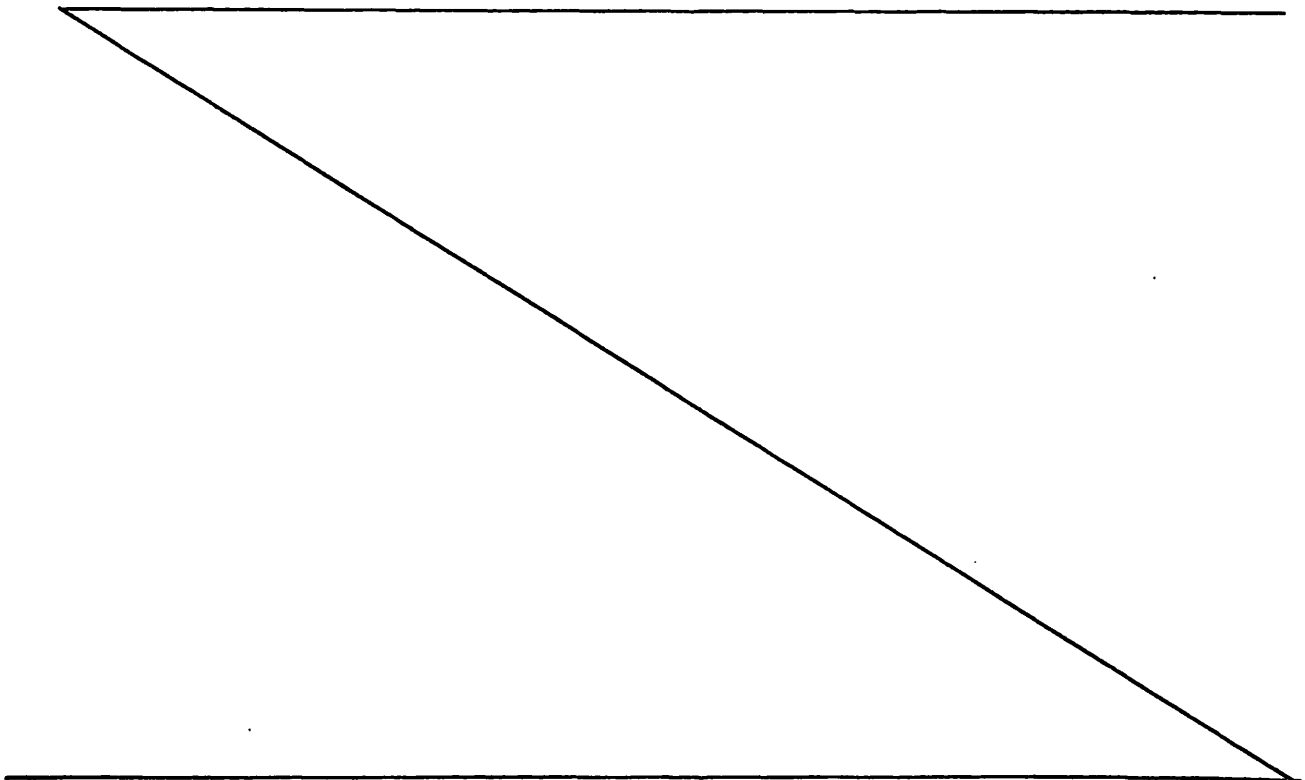

- (4) Bacteriological and chemical tests performed in compliance with the methods set forth in the U.S. Public Health Service "Drinking Water Standards" of 1946 shall be made in accordance with the requirements of the State Department of Public Health. These analysis shall be made by a laboratory approved by the State Department of Public Health in accordance with provisions of Sections 1075 to 1084, inclusive, or Sections 1174 to 1184, inclusive, of the California Administrative Code;
- (5) Necessary treatment works or improvements in operation, maintenance or construction shall be provided when needed or when required by the State Department of Public Health;
- (6) Modifications, additions, or changes in the source of supply, method of treatment, or distribution system shall comply in all particulars with the provisions of Sections 4011.5 and 4011.6 of the Health and Safety Code.



A RESOLUTION AMENDING RULE 12 OF THE PERSONNEL
RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO APPEALS AND
HEARINGS.

WHEREAS, Section 1202 of Article XII of the Charter of the City of Modesto provides that the Personnel System provided by said Article shall be implemented by such rules and regulations governing the administration thereof as are adopted by the City Council upon the recommendation of the City Manager, and

WHEREAS, Section 1109 of Article XI of the City Charter provides that the Personnel Commission shall have the power and be required to recommend to the City Council after a public hearing thereon the adoption, amendment, or repeal of personnel rules and regulations, and

WHEREAS, the Personnel Commission, after a public hearing thereon, has recommended that Rule 12 of the Personnel Rules and Regulations, relating to appeals and hearings, be amended as hereinafter set forth, and

WHEREAS, the City Manager has reviewed the proposed amendment to the Personnel Rules and Regulations as recommended by the Personnel Commission, and

WHEREAS, the Council has reviewed said amendment to the Personnel Rules and Regulations as recommended by the Personnel Commission and the City Manager and finds that said amendment promotes the purposes and objectives of the personnel system,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Modesto as follows:

SECTION 1. That Rule 12 of the Personnel Rules and Regulations be amended to read as follows:

12.1 Requests for Hearing on Disciplinary Action

Any regular employee holding a position in the classified service shall have the right of appeal to the Personnel Commission for a hearing on a suspension, demotion or dismissal, in accordance with applicable provisions of the Modesto Municipal Code.

12.2 Requests for Investigation

Any person may file with the Personnel Commission a written request for an investigation of any alleged violation of the applicable provisions of the Modesto Municipal Code. The Commission shall consider the request at its next meeting and determine if an investigation is needed and so inform the person making the request. If an investigation is made, the provisions of Rule 12.3 shall apply.

12.3 Personnel Commission Responsibility

In carrying out its responsibility for the conduct of investigations and hearings and advising the City Council and the City Manager on personnel matters, the Personnel Commission shall proceed in any manner which will, in its judgment, develop all the facts bearing upon the matter before it, and no informality in its actions will be just cause for criticism of its findings and recommendations. When the investigation or hearing is completed, the Commission shall furnish certified copies of its findings and recommendations to persons concerned, keeping one for its permanent record. Any member of the Commission may prepare and submit a minority or supplementary report for the information of the appointing authority and others concerned.

12.4 Regulations Governing the Conduct of Hearings on Disciplinary Actions

(a) Hearing Date to Be Fixed. Upon the receipt of a demand in writing for a hearing upon charges relating to the suspension, demotion, or dismissal of a city employee, submitted in accordance with the provisions of the applicable provisions of the Modesto Municipal Code, the Personnel Commission shall fix a time for a public hearing of said charges. Notice of the time and place where the hearing is to be held shall be delivered personally or sent by United States Registered Mail to the employee at his last known address as shown in the personnel records of the city prior to the hearing.

(b) Right of Employee. The employee shall have the right to be represented by counsel, to present any relevant evidence, to request the Commission to subpoena witnesses and relevant documentary evidence, and to cross-examine witnesses.

(c) Oath or Affirmation. No witness shall testify except upon oath or affirmation.

(d) Conduct of Hearing. The hearing shall be informally conducted, and the technical rules of evidence shall not apply, but the evidence shall be restricted to that relevant to the charges. Any relevant evidence shall be admitted if it is the sort of evidence on which responsible persons are accustomed to rely in the conduct of serious affairs regardless of the existence of any common law or statutory rule which might make improper the admission of such evidence over objection in civil actions. The rules of privilege shall be effective to the same extent that they are now or hereafter may be recognized in civil actions and irrelevant and unduly repetitious evidence shall be excluded.

(e) Right to Examine Employee. If the employee appealing does not testify in his own behalf, he may be subpoenaed and examined as if under cross examination.

(f) Transcript. The city may employ a competent reporter to record the proceedings. The employee may obtain a copy of such transcript upon paying the cost thereof.

(g) Exclusion of Witnesses. If either party requests it, the Commission may exclude from the hearing room any witness not at the time under examination so that he may not hear the testimony of other witnesses, but a party to the proceeding may not be so excluded.

(h) Findings and Recommendations of the Commission. Within ten (10) days after concluding the hearing, the Personnel Commission shall certify its findings and recommendations to the City Manager and to any other official from whose action the appeal was taken and to the employee affected. Such findings and recommendations shall be approved by an affirmative vote of a majority of the entire Commission. Any member or members may submit a minority report.

Definition

Employment Standards

Any combination of training and experience equivalent to graduation from college preferably including courses in appraisal, real estate law, acquisition or disposition of real property and/or business or public administration, and two years recent experience in the valuation and transfer of real property. (General experience in real estate sales will not be considered equivalent to this requirement. Additional related experience may be substituted for the required training and education on the basis of one year of experience being equivalent to two years of education.)

Desirable Qualifications

Knowledge of principles, methods and techniques involved in the appraisal, acquisition, managements, and disposition of real property; knowledge of laws concerning real property and real property transfers; knowledge of real property values, economic trends, and, in general terms, the value of or cost of improvements; knowledge of the functions, principles and practices of business or public administration; ability to establish and maintain effective working relations with individual property owners or prospects, the public, officials of other public agencies, and fellow employees; ability to gather and analyze data and to prepare accurate and concise reports.

Typical Tasks

Make estimates and appraisals of real property and rights of way costs; negotiate for the donation, sale, purchase, lease or rental of real property and improvements; assist in preparing and processing legal descriptions, deeds, easements, agreements, options, contracts and other documents pertaining to real property transactions; assist in preparing for legal actions and acting as a witness in court; confer with others to determine facts and, within the limitations of policy, to recommend courses of action,

effect solutions to problems or to guide others in taking appropriate action; with a high degree of tact and understanding to work with others; to gather data, determine facts, make recommendations and provide effective follow-up; to originate clear correspondence and to prepare concise and accurate reports and to present summaries of statistical data; assist with and help expedite and clear city projects.

A RESOLUTION CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE 14TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1957, PERTAINING TO THE ANNEXATION OF THE GARRISON SCHOOL ADDITION TO THE CITY OF MODESTO.

WHEREAS, By Resolution No. 56-442, the City Council of the City of Modesto declared its intention to call a special election to be held on the 14th day of January, 1957, in certain inhabited territory contiguous to said City proposed to be annexed to said City, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors residing in said territory the question whether or not said territory shall be annexed to said City; and

WHEREAS, a copy of said Resolution was published as required by law; and

WHEREAS, at a time not later than the hour set by said Resolution for hearing objections to the proposed election, written or oral protests were not made by the owners of one-half of the value of the territory proposed to be annexed as shown by the last equalized assessment roll or by public and private owners equal to one-half of the value of the territory proposed to be annexed; and

WHEREAS, all proceedings have been had in accordance with said Resolution and the Annexation Act of 1913, as amended, reference thereto hereby being made for further particulars;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Modesto as follows:

SECTION 1: ELECTION CALLED. A special election hereby is called to be held on the 14th day of January, 1957, in the territory hereinafter described and proposed to be annexed to the City of Modesto, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors residing in said territory the question whether or not such territory shall be annexed to, incorporated in, and made a part of said City of Modesto, and whether or not the property in said territory shall, after such annexation, be subjected to taxation equally with the property within the City of Modesto to pay the bonded indebtedness of the City of Modesto for the acquisition, construction or completion of municipal improvements outstanding or authorized at the date of the first publication of the notice of the election.

Said territory is described as follows:

All that certain real property situate in the State of California, County of Stanislaus, Sections 19 and 20, Township 3 South, Range 9 East, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian, and more particularly described as follows:

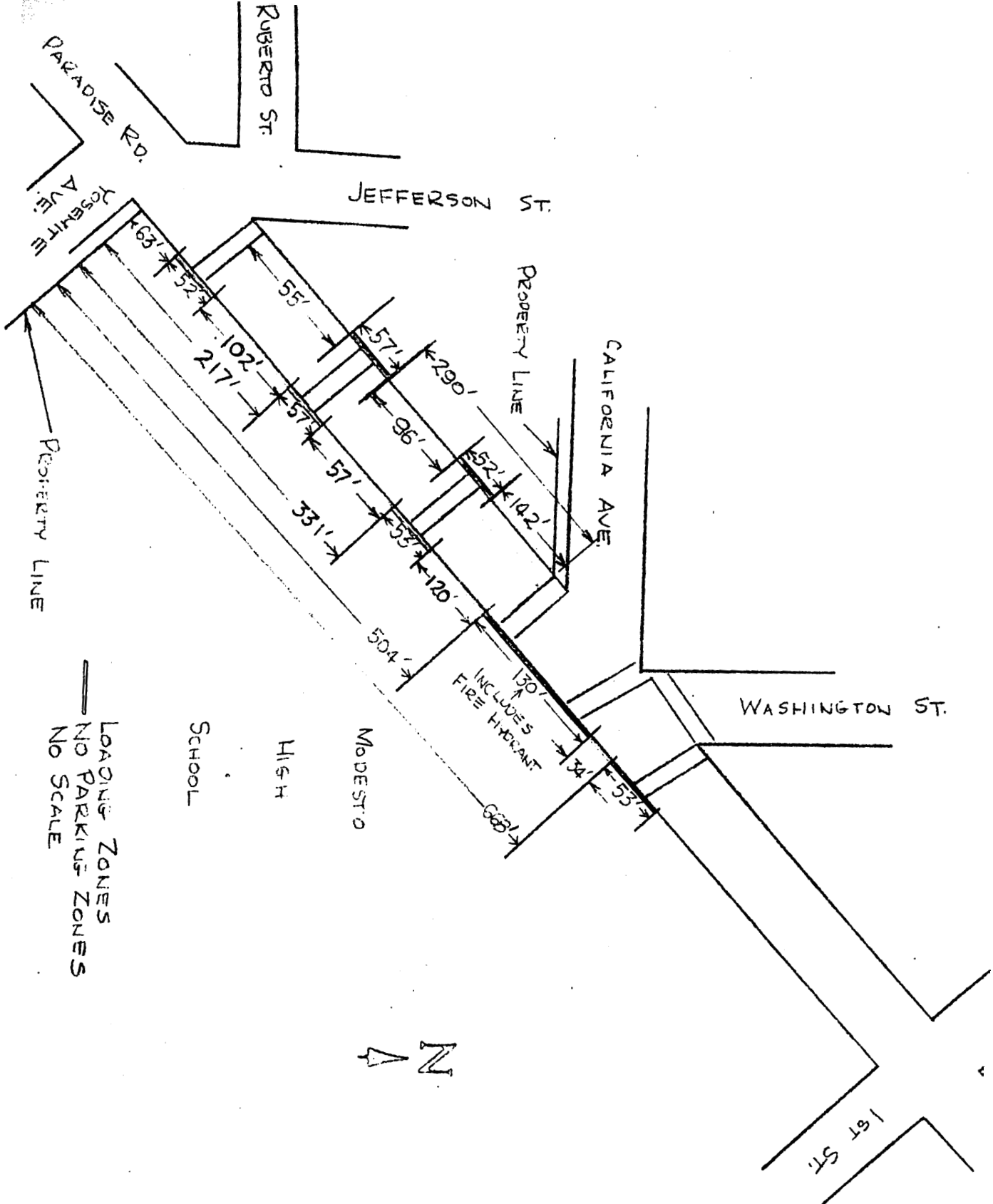

DECLARATION OF WILLINGNESS TO ADOPT A UNIFORM SALES TAX ORDINANCE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BRADLEY-BURNS UNIFORM LOCAL SALES AND USE TAX LAW AND ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH OTHER PUBLIC AGENCIES TO OBTAIN AN IMPARTIAL STUDY OF THE FISCAL RELATIONSHIPS OF PUBLIC AGENCIES OF THE COUNTY OF STANISLAUS

WHEREAS, for some time the Board of Supervisors of the County of Stanislaus and the respective City Councils of the cities within the County of Stanislaus have had under consideration the matter of adopting a uniform sales and use tax ordinance complying with the provisions of Part 1.5 of Division 2 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, known as the "Bradley-Burns Uniform Local Sales and Use Tax Law", and

WHEREAS, following failure to reach agreement regarding the division of revenues to be derived from said uniform sales tax ordinances, the Board of Supervisors appointed a citizens' advisory committee to study the matter and present its recommendations to the Board of Supervisors, and

WHEREAS, said citizens' advisory committee on uniform sales tax has met and recommends that:

(1) The County of Stanislaus and the cities within the County of Stanislaus enter into an agreement to obtain an impartial study of the fiscal relationships of public agencies in the County of Stanislaus;

(2) The County of Stanislaus and each of the cities within the County of Stanislaus adopt a uniform sales and use tax ordinance in accordance with the Bradley-Burns Uniform Local Sales and Use Tax Law; that said cities fix the rate of such local sales and use taxes at ninety-two and one-half one hundredths (0.925) of one percent of the retail sales in such cities and a similar percentage of the purchase price of personal property used, stored, or consumed in such cities, thereby permitting the County of Stanislaus to participate in the local sales and use tax collected in such cities to the extent of seven and one-half hundredths (0.075) of one percent; that said ordinances be effective April 1, 1957; and that the Board of Supervisors of the County

of Stanislaus and the City Councils of the respective cities of the County of Stanislaus agree, prior to July 1, 1957, to adjust the percentage figures based on the results of the survey;

(3) The present County of Stanislaus ordinance on uniform sales tax (No. 375) be repealed; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the County of Stanislaus and the cities of the County of Stanislaus that taxes be levied, services be rendered, and facilities provided on a fair and equitable basis; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary, in order to determine the foregoing, that a comprehensive study and analysis of the tax structure of all local public agencies in the County of Stanislaus and the services rendered and facilities supplied by them be conducted by qualified experts in such matters;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Modesto that:

1. This Council hereby declares its willingness to adopt a uniform sales and use tax ordinance in accordance with the provisions of the Bradley-Burns Uniform Sales and Use Tax Law, fixing the rate of such local sales and use taxes in such a manner as to permit the County of Stanislaus to participate in the local sales and use tax collected within the cities of the County of Stanislaus to the extent of seven and one-half hundredths (0.075) of one percent of the tax levy, said ordinances to be effective April 1, 1957, subject to the other provisions of this resolution.

2. This Council hereby declares its willingness to enter a written agreement with other local public agencies in the County of Stanislaus for the employment of a professional organization, composed of persons trained and experienced in such matters, to make an impartial study and render a complete written report concerning all fiscal relationships between local public agencies in the County of Stanislaus. The purpose of this study is to furnish the respective governmental bodies with precise information on each governmental activity, including special districts other than irrigation districts. The study shall

include, but shall not necessarily be limited to the following subjects:

- (a) Overall expenditures and revenues;
- (b) Breakdown of revenues to determine sources of revenue, both by location and amounts contributed;
- (c) Determination of beneficiaries of service by amount, percentage, and general class and location;
- (d) Analysis of the relationships between items (b) and (c) above;
- (e) Analysis of sales tax revenues derived from existing legislation and those projected under the uniform sales tax ordinances;
 - (1) Percentage distribution to cities in other California counties, including special or multi-purpose dedication of receipts;
 - (2) Quarterly schedules of sales tax receipts of incorporated areas in Stanislaus County;
 - (3) Determination of sources and location of sources of present receipts;
 - (4) Analysis of expenditure of locally administered sales tax receipts;
 - (5) Projection of receipts under uniform county sales tax based on varying distribution formula; and
 - (6) Projection of sources and location of sources under (5) above.

In the event that any public agency in the County of Stanislaus desires to obtain information not included in the general study or information on governmental agencies not included above, it may obtain such studies and reports at its own expense.

3. The costs of such studies and reports shall be on participating agencies on the following basis. Preliminary contributions to cover the cost of the surveys shall be made on a pro rata basis of the percentage of retail sales made within each of the incorporated cities and the unincorporated area as reported by the State Board of Equalization in its report of January 1, 1955. The final total

cost of the survey shall be equalized on the basis of the percentage of retail sales as revealed by the studies and reports.

4. Upon completion of the aforesaid studies and reports, including any supplemental reports obtained by any governmental agency at its own cost from the organization employed to make the general study, and not later than July 1, 1957, all participating local public agencies shall make such adjustments in local fiscal relationships which, in their opinion, the studies and reports reveal to be necessary to assure that taxes are levied, services rendered, and facilities provided on a fair and equitable basis.

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A NO PARKING ZONE ON THE NORTH SIDE OF MILLER AVENUE BETWEEN LA LOMA AND COVENA AVENUES IN THE CITY OF MODESTO.

WHEREAS, Section 34.1 of Ordinance No. 345-N.S. of the City of Modesto, as amended, authorizes the City Council, by resolution, to restrict or prohibit the parking of motor vehicles upon designated streets of the City if the general welfare and safety of the citizens so require it, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Modesto finds and determines that the best interests of the citizens of the City require that parking in a specified place on the north side of Miller Avenue between La Loma Avenue and Covena Avenue in the City of Modesto be prohibited as hereinafter provided,

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for the operator of a vehicle to park or stop such vehicle in the following place in the City of Modesto:

Beginning at a point on the northerly curb line of Miller Avenue at its intersection with the easterly property line of Santa Cruz Avenue and continuing easterly along said curb line to the westerly property line of Covena Avenue.

SECTION 2. The Traffic Engineer is hereby directed to cause the above described area to be marked and posted in accordance with the provisions of this resolution and the applicable laws of the City of Modesto.

A RESOLUTION REJECTING THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE MODESTO CITY PLANNING COMMISSION THAT SECTION 27 OF THE ZONING MAP BE AMENDED TO REZONE THE AREA SET FORTH IN RESOLUTION NO. 355, ADOPTED BY THE COMMISSION ON NOVEMBER 8, 1956, AND REQUESTING A FURTHER REPORT FROM THE COMMISSION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 10-2.2114 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 349, the Modesto City Planning Commission initiated proceedings to amend Section 27 of the Zoning Map to reclassify from Single-Family Residential Zone (R-1) and Two-Family Residential Zone (R-2) to Neighborhood Commercial Zone (C-1) the following described property:

The area bounded on the east by the north-south alley between Covena Avenue and Camellia Way; on the south by the commercial zoning north of Yosemite Boulevard; on the west by LaLoma; and on the north by Miller Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Commission held a public hearing in the Council Chamber, located in the McHenry Public Library at 14th and I Streets, in the City of Modesto on October 16, 1956, on the proposed amendment and evidence, both oral and documentary, was taken and introduced, and

WHEREAS, thereafter the Commission adopted Resolution No. 355, recommending to the Council that the rezoning of the area be approved, and

WHEREAS, said matter was set for public hearing before the Council in the Council Chamber located in the McHenry Public Library at 14th and I Streets, in the City of Modesto at 8:00 P.M. December 26, 1956, and

WHEREAS, said hearing was held before the Council at the above time and place, and evidence, both oral and documentary, was taken and introduced and the Council found and determined that

1. The rezoning of the area would not be required by public necessity, convenience and general welfare;
2. It would not carry out the purposes of the zoning regulations;
3. An over-abundance of commercial zoning exists in the area.
