TRACK ACROSS ALLEY IN BLOCK 136 AND ACROSS "B" STREET IN

A Resolution granting to the Central Pacific Railway Company, a Corporation, its successors and assigns, a permit to lay down, construct, maintain and operate a drill track of standard gauge over and across alley in Block 136 and across "B" Street, located in the City of Modesto, County of Stanislaus, State of California, for the purpose of serving industrial property, the particular description of said drill track necessary for the purpose aforesaid being as follows:

"B" Street Crossing

Beginning at a point on the south line of "B" Street 260-ft. westerly along the south line of "B" Street from the southwest corner of "B" and 9th Streets, thence across "B" Street 115.7-ft. to the north line of "B" Street, said point being 343.7 ft. westerly along the north line of "B" Street from the northwest corner of "B" and 9th Streets.

5. That this permit shall be revocable at the pleasure of the City Council of the City of Modesto.

The Council in said regulations shall give reasonable consideration among other things to the character of the districts provided for and prescribed, their peculiar suitability for particular uses, the conservation of property values and the direction of building development in accord with such plans as the Council may consider and adopt. The authority herein conferred and the work herein specified to be done may be done either under the general laws of the State of California or pursuant to the Charter and provisions of the City of Modesto and the powers conferred by the State Constitution.

SECTION II.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the people at the General Election to be held in the City of Modesto on April 9, 1929.

- (4) That the Charter be amended so as to permit the sale or exchange of the land now used for a municipal airport or aviation field for other land more adaptable thereto;
- (5) That a disinterested Committee be appointed to act during the next two years and, pending the adoption of the charter amendment above suggested, to select Airport Sites of sufficient size and suitably located and secure options thereon for the City, and
