THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the City Council of the City of Modesto go on record as being opposed to the adoption of the proposed legislation; that the Senator and Assemblywomen from this District be respectfully requested to use their vote and influence against the adoption of such a measure, and that a copy of this Resolution be sent to Honorable L. L. Dennett, Senator from this District, and Miss Esto Broughton, Assemblywoman from this District.

Providing for a general municipal election in and for the City of Modesto and a General Election in and for the Modesto City School District.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Modesto as follows:

That under and pursuant to the Charter of the City of Modesto, a general municipal election in and for the City of Modesto be and the same is hereby called to be held on

Tuesday, the 14th day of April, 1925, for the purpose of electing the following officers for the City of Modesto, to-wit: Two Councilmen, and voting upon the question of the adoption of an ordinance submitted in accordance with Section 89 of the Charter of the City of Modesto, entitled, "An Ordinance providing for the appointment of a Recreation Commission and a Superintendent of Recreation; fixing their powers and duties, and providing for the payment of their salaries and the expenses connected with the exercise of their powers and duties;" and a general election in and for the Modesto City School District is likewise called to be held on the same day, to-wit: on Tuesday, the 4th day of April, 1925, for the purpose of electing certain officers of the said Modesto City School District, to-wit: Two members of the Board of Education of the Modesto City School District.

For the purpose of holding said election, the said City of Modesto and that portion of the Modesto City School District lying within the corporate limits of the City of Modesto shall be, and the same is hereby precincted and established into eight election precincts, to be known and designated as follows:

Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 1.

Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 2.

Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 3.

Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 4.

Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 5.

Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 6.

Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 7.

Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 8.

Said special election or consolidated election precincts are established by consolidating the general election precincts within the City of Modesto (except as herein-after noted), as established by the orders or resolution of the Board of Supervisors of Stanislaus County, California, now in force for general election purposes within the City, (which said orders or resolutions now on file and of record in the office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of Stanislaus County are hereby referred to and by such reference made a part hereof for greater certainty and a more particular description of the boundaries thereof), in the following manner, (said precincts so established by said Board of Supervisors being herein referred to as General Election Precincts);

Said General Election Precincts so designated by said Board of Supervisors as Modesto No. 1, Modesto No. 2, Modesto No. 3, and Modesto No. 4, are hereby consolidated and established into "Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 1."

Said General Election Precincts so designated by said Board of Supervisors as Modesto No. 5, Modesto No. 6, and Modesto No. 7 are hereby consolidated and established into "Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 2;"

Said General Election Precincts so designated by said Board of Supervisors as Modesto No. 8, Modesto No. 9, Modesto No. 10 and Modesto No. 11, are hereby consolidated and established into "Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 3;"

Said General Election Precincts so designated by said Board of Supervisors as Modesto No. 14, Modesto No. 16 and Modesto No. 17 are hereby consolidated and established into "Special Election or Consolidated Election Precinct No. 4;"

WHEREAS, there is now growing upon certain private property in the City of Modesto, and also upon certain streets or sidewalks in front of certain private property, all of which said private property is hereinafter described, certain weeds which bear seeds of a wingy or downy nature, or attain such a large growth as to become a fire menace when dry, or which are otherwise noxious or dangerous.

Now therefore, be It resolved, that the said weeds so growing upon the private property hereinafter described, or on the streets or sidewalks in front of the private property hereinafter described, be, and the same is hereby declared to be a public nuisance.

Be it further resolved, that said nuisance be abated in accordance with an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled: "An act authorizing municipalities to declare noxious or dangerous weeds growing upon the streets or sidewalks, or upon private property within municipalities, to be a public nuisance, creating a lien upon the property fronting upon such streets or sidewalks or upon which such nuisance exists for the cost of abating the same." (Approved May 26, 1915).

Be it further resolved that after the passage of this Resolution the Street

Superintendent shall cause to be conspicuously posted in front of the hereinafter described property on which, or in front of which such nuisance exists at not more than 100 feet in distance apart, but not less than three in all, notices headed: "Notice to destroy weeds", as provided in Section 3 of the act hereinabove referred to, and that the date when objections to the proposed removal of such weeds will be heard is hereby specified to be the 18th day of May, 1926, at the hour of 7:30 P.M. at the Council Chambers in the City of Modesto.

The real property on which or upon the streets or sidewalks in front of which said weeds so declared to be a public nuisance are growing, are upon the following described streets, and are described by lot and block number, as follows: The description of lot and block number being according to the official map of the City of Modesto adopted by the City Council on January 14, 1920, and on file in Vol. 10 of Maps, in the office of the County Recorder of Stanislaus County, California, to-wit:

The compensation of the Chief Draughtsman in the office of the City Engineer shall be the sum of One hundred seventy-five (\$175.00) Dollars per month.

The compensation of the Deputy City Engineer shall be Two hundred twenty-five (\$225.00) Dollars per month.

Said compensation shall be payable to the said officers and employees on the first day of each and every month at the office of the City Clerk, in the same manner that other officers and employees of the City of Modesto are now paid.
