

RESOLUTION NO. 429. N. S.

WHEREAS, sidewalks have been ordered installed on the northwest side of "H" Street in the City of Modesto from Second Street to Washington Street; and

WHEREAS, some of the property owners on the northwest side of "H" Street between Second and Washington have so constructed their improvements as to encroach beyond the property lines, and the construction of the sidewalk the usual distance from the curb line of the street would compel the removal of buildings, lawns, trees, shrubs, and fences; and

WHEREAS, for the present the public can be accommodated as conveniently without the removal of said encroachments upon the street, by the construction of a sidewalk nearer to the curb line than the usual distance;

NOW, THEREFOR, be it resolved that permission be and the same is hereby granted to the property owners on the northwest side of "H" Street between Second Street and Washington Street within the City of Modesto to so construct the sidewalks that the outer edge thereof shall be two feet from the outer edge of the curb line on said street between said points.

Be it Further Resolved that this permission is given upon the express condition that is is without disparagement of the right of the City to the full width of the Street, and shall not be construed as constituting any waiver by the said City of Modesto of any portion of the street to the abutting property owners, nor as the creation of any different property line than the one that appears upon the official map of the City of Modesto, nor as constituting anything but a license to the abutting property owners to maintain their present buildings and improvements now encroaching upon the street beyond the limits of their property lines.

RESOLUTION NO. 430 - N.S.

WHEREAS, heretofore at a special election held in the City of Modesto on the 22nd day of October, 1918, pursuant to the laws of the State of California, and in accordance with Ordinance No. 128-N.S. and other ordinances of the City of Modesto relative to elections therein, the said City was authorized to incur an indebtedness of the sum of Sixty Seven Thousand Five Hundred (\$67,500.00) Dollars, for the purposes in said ordinance set forth, and was authorized to issue bonds for the amount of said indebtedness; and

WHEREAS, thereafter an ordinance, to-wit: Ordinance No. 132--N.S. was duly adopted by the City Council of the City of Modesto, providing for the issuance of said bonds; and

WHEREAS, thereafter by a resolution of the City Council of the City of Modesto the said bonds were ordered to be sold, and the Clerk of said City was directed to advertise for bids for the purchase of said bonds; and

WHEREAS, said Clerk did so advertise for bids for the sale of said bonds, which bids were to be opened on this 10th day of January, 1919, at eight o'clock P.M. and

WHEREAS, at this time and place, to-wit: the Council Chambers of the City of Modesto, California, at eight o'clock P.M. on January 10th, 1919, being the time and place mentioned for receiving and opening said bids, certain bids were received and opened; and

WHEREAS, after the examination of said bids it appears to said Council, and the said Council so finds, that the bid of the Anglo and London Paris National Bank of San Francisco; a corporation, for said bonds, in the sum of \$68,435.75 is the highest and best bid, and the said The Anglo and London Paris National Bank of San Francisco is the highest and best bidder for said bonds;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the bid of The Anglo and London Paris National Bank of San Francisco for bonds of the City of Modesto authorized to be issued as hereinabove recited, in the sum of Sixty Seven Thousand Five Hundred (\$67,500.00) Dollars, par value, all bearing date January 2nd, 1919, of the denomination of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars each, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum payable semi-annually on January 2nd and July 2nd, and maturing four bonds thereof on January 2 in each of the years 1920 to 1924 inclusive, and five bonds thereof maturing on January 2nd in each of the years from 1925 to 1947 inclusive, be and the same is hereby accepted, and that the said bonds be awarded and sold to said The Anglo and London Paris National Bank of San Francisco, a corporation, upon the payment to said City of Modesto the said sum of \$68,435.75, and accrued interest on said bonds from January 2nd, 1919, to the date of delivery.

Be it further Resolved: that the Cashier's check of the said The Anglo and London Paris National Bank of San Francisco for the sum of Six Thousand Nine Hundred (\$6900.00) Dollars, accompanying said bid, be retained by the City, and upon the delivery of said bonds that the same be applied on account of the payment of said purchase price.

Resolution of Intention No. 78.

Being a Resolution of Intention to Close "P" Street in the City of Modesto.

WHEREAS, Byron A. Bearce filed with this Council his request or petition that "P" Street for its entire length from the northeasterly side of Ninth Street to the southerly line of Needham Avenue be closed and abandoned; and

WHEREAS, said Byron A. Bearce is the owner of the property on both sides of said street for its entire length; and

WHEREAS, the public interest and convenience require the doing of the work hereinafter specified, to-wit: the closing of "P" Street for its entire length;

W. organizations and the Bolshevist and other non-american elements have recently taken place in the City of Seattle, the tendency and nature of which, had it been successful, were such as to have vitally effected not only the City of Seattle and the neighborhood thereof, but also the whole nation disrupting and disorganizing industry and threatening an overflow of civil government; and

WHEREAS, the situation resulting from this disturbance was handled by the officials of the City of Seattle, and in particular the Mayor, Ole Hansen, with such skill, energy and courage as to bring about the almost immediate collapse thereof, in consequence of which this Council feels that the public officials of the City of Seattle are entitled to the gratitude of the entire Country.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the City of Modesto that said City and its citizens and people extend to the public officials of the City of Seattle, and particularly its Mayor, Ole Hansen, a vote of felicitation and thanks; that we heartily commend the said officials for the able and courageous manner in which the situation was handled; that while we recognize and approve the proper organization of labor for its own protection and welfare, nevertheless we condemn the conduct and spirit of the I. W. W., Bolsheviki and other non-American organizations in seeking to create disturbances, foment dissatisfaction and overthrow civil government.

That the alley between Tenth and Eleventh streets from the northwesterly line of "K" Street northwesterly to the southeasterly line of "L" street excepting therefrom any of said work already done to the official grade also excepting however, from all of the aforesaid work such portions as are required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or corporation having railroad tracks thereon.

Be graded and thereupon paved to the official grade with a four inch Portland cement concrete base and one and one-half inch Bitulithic wearing surface, and curbed with redwood curbing. And whereas, said contemplated work and improvement, in the opinion of the City Council is of more than local or ordinary public benefit, said Council makes the expense of said work or improvement chargeable upon a district, which district said Council hereby declares to be the district benefited by said work and improvement to be ^{assessed} assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof, which said district is bounded and described as follows:

Kinnear who personally posted the same, and who, upon the completion of the posting of said notices, forthwith filed said affidavit in the office of the City Clerk, making oath that he completed the posting of said notices, on the 3rd, day of March, 1919; and whereas, all protests or objections presented have been disposed of in time, form and manner as required by law, the City Council having found that saod protests were made by owners of less than one-half of the area of the property to be assesses for said improvements, and said City Council having now required jurisdiction to order the proposed improvement, it is hereby

RESOLVED, that the public interest and convenience require the work herein described and the City Council of the City of M_odesto hereby order the following work to be done and improvement to be made in said City, to-wit:

That Stanislaus Avenue from the easterly line of Franklin Street easterly to the westerly line of Washington street excepting therefrom any of said work already done to the official grade also excepting howeve, from all of the aforescribed work such portions as are

required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or corporation having railroad tracks thereon.

WHEREAS, after the passage and adoption of said Resolution of Intention, proceedings as required by law were duly and regularly had, whereby a contract for the doing of the work in said Resolution specified was awarded and entered into by the Superintendent of Streets of the City of Modesto on behalf of the said City with the person to whom said contract was awarded, and the work therein ordered was performed in accordance with the conditions of said Contract and said Resolution of Intention, and a warrant was issued to the contractor therefor, and no appeal taken to the City Council in connection therewith, and after the full expiration of the Thirty days from date of the warrant, and after the Street Superintendent made and filed with the Clerk of the City Council a complete list of all assessments unpaid upon any assessment or diagram number in connection therewith (said return and list of assessments and assessment or diagram numbers now on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City being hereby referred to for greater certainty), all of which the City Council find, determine and declare to be the facts, the City Clerk did then give notice of the filing of said list and of the time therein fixed by said Clerk where interested persons might appear before the City Council and show cause why bonds should not be issued upon the security of the unpaid assessments shown on said list, which time was that of some regular meeting of the City Council and which said notice was posted and published as required by law; and

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby declared and found by said City Council that all of the acts and things required by law and the ordinances of this City relative to the calling, conducting and holding of said election to be done and performed, have been done and performed; that the proper and necessary resolution required by law was introduced and passed by a two-thirds vote of the City Council and approved by the executive of said municipality; that an ordinance, containing all of the statements and things required by law to be contained therein, calling said election, was duly introduced, passed and approved and published in the manner and for the time required by law; that said special election was in every respect held and conducted as required by law and the ordinances of this City; that the returns thereof were duly and regularly made and filed with the City Clerk and were duly opened and canvassed by said City Council as required by law, and that the results of said special election and the votes cast for each of the propositions submitted were as hereinafter set forth, to-wit:

1. For incurring an indebtedness for the improvement of the streets of said City of Modesto by improving the intersections of the accepted streets of said City, by grading and thereupon paving with an asphalt concrete pavement and constructing cement curbs and gutters, and the construction and placing in position of culverts, all upon certain street intersections in said City of Modesto, all to be in accordance with the plans and specifications adopted and on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City of Modesto, of the estimated cost of \$100,000. 682 votes were cast in favor of incurring said indebtedness and 211 votes were cast against incurring said indebtedness.

2. For incurring an indebtedness for the acquisition, construction and completion of a system of storm sewers in and for said City of Modesto to supplement the present sewer system and in particular to carry off and dispose of the storm waters, in accordance with the preliminary plans heretofore prepared therefor by the City Engineer and on file in the office of the Clerk of the City of Modesto, the estimated cost of which will be \$75,000. 671 votes were cast in favor of incurring said indebtedness and 208 votes were cast against incurring said indebtedness.

3. For incurring an indebtedness for the construction and completion of additional sanitary sewers in and for the City of Modesto, according to the plans and estimates filed in the office of the Clerk by the City Engineer, the estimated cost of which will be \$35,000. 672 votes were cast in favor of incurring said indebtedness and 222 votes were cast against incurring said indebtedness.

4. For incurring an indebtedness for the acquisition, construction and completion of an addition to the liquifying tank and filter beds in connection with the sewer system of the City of Modesto, according to estimates thereof filed in the office of the City Clerk by the City Engineer, the estimated cost of which will be \$30,000. 637 votes were cast in favor of incurring said indebtedness and 244 votes were cast against incurring said indebtedness.

5. For incurring an indebtedness for the construction and completion by way of extension of the municipal water system of the City of Modesto, including additional wells and additional pumping equipment, as per plans and estimates thereof filed in the office of the City Clerk by the City Engineer, the estimated cost of which is \$49,000. 648 votes were cast in favor of incurring said indebtedness and 237 votes were cast against incurring said indebtedness.

6. For incurring an indebtedness for the purchase and acquisition of street flushing and street sprinkling apparatus as per plans and estimates filed with the City Clerk by the Street Superintendent, the estimated cost of which will be \$16,000. 566 votes were cast in favor of incurring said indebtedness and 308 votes were cast against incurring said indebtedness.

7. For incurring an indebtedness for the acquisition of the necessary land for, and the construction and completion thereon, of an aviation landing field and Industrial Exposition Park to be known as the Fair Grounds, in connection therewith, including the development and equipment of the same, the estimated cost of which will be

the sum of \$50,000. 550 votes were cast in favor of incurring said indebtedness and 324 votes were cast against incurring said indebtedness.

8. For incurring an indebtedness for the purchase and acquisition of additional ground or land adjacent to the so-called Dry Creek Park and the construction and establishment thereon of a park for the City of Modesto, and the acquisition of equipment for the same, according to plans and estimates filed with the City Clerk, the estimated cost of which will be \$15,000. 495 votes were cast in favor of incurring said indebtedness, and 372 votes were cast against incurring said indebtedness.

9. For incurring an indebtedness for the acquisition, construction and completion of street lighting apparatus and equipment for the municipal lighting of the streets of the City of Modesto, and as an incident thereto the construction and completion of a system of electric police calls, according to plans submitted to and on file with the City Clerk, the estimated cost of which will be the sum of \$20,000.

577 votes were cast in favor of incurring said indebtedness and 295 votes were cast against incurring said indebtedness.

10. For incurring an indebtedness for the acquisition of a site within the City of Modesto for the construction of a City Hall, the estimated cost of which will be \$20,000. 517 votes were cast in favor of incurring said indebtedness and 352 votes were cast against incurring said indebtedness.

That the total number of votes cast at said election was 925; that the affirmative of each of the following propositions, to-wit:

1. For the improvement of the streets of said City of Modesto by improving the intersections of the accepted streets of said City, by grading and thereupon paving with an asphalt concrete pavement and constructing cement curbs and gutters, and the construction and placing in position of culverts, all upon certain street intersections in said City of Modesto, all to be in accordance with the plans and specifications adopted and on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City of Modesto of the estimated cost of \$100,000.

5. For the construction and completion by way of extension of the municipal water system of the City of Modesto, including additional wells and additional pumping equipment, as per plans and estimates thereof filed in the office of the City Clerk by the City Engineer, the estimated cost of which is \$49,000.

RESOLUTION NO. 503 N. S.

AN ORDER PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Modesto did on the 14th day of May, 1919, pass its Resolution of Intention No. 83 for the improvement of Fourteenth Street from the southeast line of D Street southeasterly to the westerly line of Burney Street, also for the improvement of Grand Street from the westerly line of Burney Street easterly to the westerly end of the cement concrete bridge crossing Dry Creek within the City of Modesto, Stanislaus County, California, under and pursuant to the provisions of the "Improvement Act of 1911", and the amendments thereto and to the resolution, notices and other proceedings of said City duly adopted and taken, reference to said Resolution of Intention being hereby expressly made for further particulars; and

WHEREAS, the contract for said work and improvement was duly awarded and thereafter duly completed to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Streets of said City and this Council, whereupon a warrant, diagram and assessment were made, recorded and delivered to the contractor in time, form and manner as required by said act, and the contractor having made due return thereon and the same having been duly recorded; and

WHEREAS, on the 12th day of December, 1919, the Street Superintendent of said City made and filed with the Clerk of this Council a complete list of all assessments unpaid thereunder upon the respective assessment or diagram numbers thereon, whereupon said Clerk gave notice of the filing of said list, and fixed in said notice Wednesday, the 24th day of December, 1919, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P. M., as the time when interested persons might appear before the City Council and show cause why bonds should not be issued upon the security of the unpaid assessments shown on said list said time being that of ^a ~~this~~ regular meeting of said Council; and

WHEREAS, for lack of quorum the meeting of said Council set for December, 24th, 1919, was regularly continued to this, the 29th, day of December, 1919, and

WHEREAS, the Council having heard all objections and having passed upon the same, it is hereby determined that the assessments unpaid thereunder and the aggregate amounts of same are as follows:
