

RESOLUTION NO. 396- N. S.

WHEREAS, the Modesto City School District of Stanislaus County, California, a public corporation, has heretofore presented to and filed with the Council of the City of Modesto its application and petition asking that certain streets and alleys hereinafter described within the City of Modesto be vacated and abandoned for the reasons therein set forth; and

WHEREAS, the said Modesto City School District is the owner of all the property adjacent to said streets and alleys within the limits within which it is proposed to close and abandon the same; and

WHEREAS, this Council deems it for the best interest of all parties concerned that said portion of said streets and alleys therein described be vacated and abandoned;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Modesto that all the alleys in Blocks 1, 2 and 3 of the University Addition to the City of Modesto, according to the map or plat thereof filed in the Recorder's Office of Stanislaus County, California, for the entire width of said alleys, and for the distance only of said blocks, and all of Center Street and Colorado Avenue where they adjoin Blocks 1, 2 and 3 of said University Addition for the length only for which they adjoin said University Addition, and also the intersection of Center Street and Colorado Avenue within said University Addition, be abandoned and vacated, saving and reserving, however, to the City of Modesto the right to extend through the alley running easterly and westerly through Blocks 2 and 3 of said University Addition such water mains as may be necessary to be laid therein for water service within said City, and to maintain, care for and operate water mains therethrough, and to go upon said premises for any purpose connected therewith and to install or remove water hydrants therefrom.

Be it further resolved that the Mayor and City Clerk of said City of Modesto be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to deliver to the Modesto School District of Stanislaus County, California, a deed conveying the streets and alleys herein abandoned and vacated to the owners of the property adjacent to the vacated and abandoned portions thereof, to-wit: the Modesto City School District of Stanislaus County/

RESOLUTION NO. 897-N. S.

WHEREAS, the Modesto Interurban Railway Company, a corporation, has this day filed with the City Council of the City of Modesto its application for permission to lay down, construct and maintain railroad tracks and crossings, and run cars thereon for the purpose of connecting warehouses, manufactories, or other business industries and enterprises with the line of said The Modesto Interurban Railway Company, which does now enter the City of Modesto, as described in its said application this day filed with the City Clerk, and now on file in his office, to which reference is hereby made;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that a permit be and the same is hereby granted to the Modesto Interurban Railway Company, a corporation, to lay down, construct and maintain railroad tracks and crossings over the public streets and alleys and at the points and in the manner and to the number herein designated, which said proposed crossings are described as follows and are indicated upon the plat attached to said application, made a part thereof and marked "Exhibit A".

One: A crossing of "D" Street and southern extremity of alley in Block 51 between Ninth and Tenth Street, by three tracks.

Two: A crossing of "C" Street between Ninth and Tenth Street, by three tracks.

Three: A crossing of "B" Street between Ninth and Tenth Street, by four tracks.

Four: A crossing of Ninth Street and Tidewater Southern tracks at "B" Street by one track with a connection to spur serving Pratt-Lowe Cannery.

Five: A crossing of Ninth Street between Sunset Boulevard and "B" Street by one track.

Six: A crossing of "B" Street between Tenth and Eleventh Street by three tracks.

Seven: A crossing of "C" Street between Tenth and Eleventh Street by five tracks.

Eight: A crossing of Tenth Street between "C" and "D" Streets by one track.

Nine: A crossing of Eleventh Street between "B" and "C" Streets by one track.

Ten: A crossing of "C" Street between Twelfth and Thirteenth Streets by two tracks.

Provided, however, that the permission herein granted shall be in all particulars and respects strictly subject to the terms and conditions of Subdivision 60 of Section 4 of the Charter of the City of Modesto with the same force and effect as if said conditions and restrictions were written in extenso herein.

RESOLUTION NO. 398 N. S.

WHEREAS, on June 11, 1917, a contract in writing was entered into by and between the City of Modesto and the Western Well Works for the construction by said Western Well Works within the said City of Modesto of a well for domestic water supply, 2200 feet deep, by what is known as the rotary hydraulic system, and

WHEREAS, after the partial construction and completion of said well, in accordance with said contract, the same collapsed, rendering necessary the construction of a new well in lieu thereof, and,

WHEREAS, both parties to said contract believe that a more satisfactory well can be obtained by certain modifications in the contract and the plans and specifications and

WHEREAS, said Western Well Works has been paid the sum of \$2,000 on its contract price of \$2795 for the construction of said well, exclusive of the installation of the pumping machinery and equipment;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved, that the Mayor and City Clerk of the City of Modesto be and they are hereby authorized and directed on behalf of said City to enter into a contract with said Western Wells Works modifying said contract of June 11, 1917 in the following particulars; that a new well be constructed by said Western Well Works on the same lot of ground, at a point to be designated by the City Engineer of the City of Modesto, in accordance in all particulars with the contract dated June 11, 1917, and the specifications therein mentioned and referred to, except that in lieu of concreting around the casing to a depth of 60 feet, a conductor pipe, of 10 gauge Arm C. Iron, 30 inches in diameter, shall be installed to a depth of 80 feet, more or less, from the surface of the ground, depending upon the depth at which a good landing for the same may be secured, the space between said conductor pipe and the casing of the well to be filled with gravel; and except, also, that in lieu of a well with an inside diameter of 24 inches, the inside of the well shall only have a diameter of 20 inches, cased with double 12 gauge hard red sheet steel casing; and except, also that the balance of the contract price for the construction of the well, to-wit: \$795, shall not be paid until the completion and acceptance of the same by the City, and that the following additions to and deductions from said contract price shall be made; Add to the contract price of \$2795 the sum of \$3.25 for each lineal foot of 30 inch single 10 gauge conductor pipe installed; Deduct from the contract price the sum of \$1.31 per lineal foot for the 20 " double 12 gauge casing installed in lieu of the 24 inch casing. Said contract shall also stipulate that the gravel envelope installed around said 20 inch casing shall be so dense as to effectually control the entrance of sand with water into the casing, eliminate caving conditions on outside of casing, and effectually prevent well collapse.

Be it Further Resolved that said contract shall not take effect nor release said Western Well Works from any of its obligations under the contract of June 11, 1917, until the sureties on the two bonds given in connection with said contract shall have signified their assent in writing to the contract as modified, and agreed to be bound thereby to the same extent as if the exceptions had been made a part of the original contract.

RESOLVED, that it is the intention of the City Council of the City of Modesto, to order the following work to be done and improvement to be made in said City to-wit:

That "D" Street from the northeasterly line of Ninth Street to the southwesterly line of Fourteenth Street, be graded; and that a strip twenty one (21) feet wide, the same being ten and one half feet on each side of the center line of "D" Street; be paved to the official grade with a four inch Portland cement concrete base and a one and one half (1½) inch bitulithic wearing surface, excepting therefrom any of said work already done to the official line and grade.

Excepting, however, from all of the aforescribed work, such portions as is required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore adopted for doing said work and now on file in the office of the City Clerk and where certain work proposed to be done on the respective streets, avenues and highways aforementioned is described as being between certain lines, it included the doing of all such work upon the street intersections and terminations between such lines, unless otherwise shown on the plans; providing however, that any duplication in such description shall be ignored.

And whereas, said contemplated work and improvement, in the opinion of the City Council is of more than local or ordinary public benefit said City Council hereby makes the expense of said work or improvement, chargeable upon a district, which district said City Council hereby declares to be the district benefited by said work and improvement, and to be assessed to pay the cost and expenses thereof; which said district is bounded and described as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of the northeasterly line of Ninth Street with the southwesterly line of "D" Street

Excepting, however, from all of the aforescribed work, such portions as is required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon.

That the following streets or parts of streets be closed in part by narrowing the same to sixty feet, to lie equally on each side of the center of said streets as now laid out, and by abandoning and vacating the ten feet on each side of the sixty feet, said ten feet to be next to the property line as now existing, to-wit:

"C" Street between Ninth and Burney Street; Tenth Street between "B" Street and its southeastern terminus; Eleventh Street from "D" Street to its southeastern terminus; Twelfth Street from "D" Street to its southeastern terminus; and Thirteenth Street from "D" Street to its southeastern terminus; which said resolution of Intention and the record thereof in the office of the City Clerk of said City is here by referred to and made a part hereof for greater certainty; and

WHEREAS, the Street Superintendent of the City of Modesto did thereupon cause to be conspicuously posted along the line of said contemplated work or improvement at not more than three hundred (300) feet in distance apart, but not less than three in all, notices of the passage of said resolution as provided in Section 3 of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California entitled: "An Act to Provide for laying out, Opening, Extending, Widening, Straightening, or Closing up in Whole or in Part any Street, Square, Lane Alley, Court or Place within Municipalities, and to Condemn and Acquire any and all land and property necessary or convenient for that purpose." Approved March 6th, 1889; and the acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto; and also cause a notice similar in substance to be published for a period of ten days in a daily newspaper published and circulated in said City and designated by said City Council therefor; and

WHEREAS, no written or other objection or protest to the said proposed work was made, filed or presented or delivered to the Clerk of the City Council within ten days or any other time after the expiration of the time for said notice; and

NOW, THEREFORE, it is by the said City Council found and declared that the public interest and convenience require the following street work or improvement to be done, and the same is hereby ordered to be done, to-wit:

That "A" street be closed for its entire length; That the alleys in Blocks 48, 49, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, S, T, R, 99, Q and 100 be closed. Subject, however, to the right of the said City to use said alleys for the laying down and use of water and gas mains and the construction of sewers, with the free right of access and ingress over the same in case of fire, and on the condition further that if the use of said alleys for railroad track purposes should be abandoned, then said alley shall revert to the City of Modesto for the free use of the same now used.

It is further ordered that the following streets or parts of streets be closed in part by narrowing the same to sixty feet in width, said sixty feet to lie equally on each side of the center of said Streets as now laid out, and by abandoning and vacating the ten feet on each side of said Sixty feet, said ten feet to be next to the property line as now existing, to-wit;

"C" Street between Ninth and Burney Streets; Tenth Street between "B" Street

and its southeastern terminus; Eleventh street from "D" street to its southeastern terminus; Twelfth Street from "D" street to its southeastern terminus; and Thirteenth Street from "D" Street to its southeastern terminus.

It is further ordered that the Mayor and the City Clerk of the City of Modesto, of behalf of the said City, execute and deliver Deeds of Conveyance to the owners of the property adjacent to the Streets and alleys or portions thereof hereby closed and abandoned or narrowed in accordance with this resolution, and subject to the reservations and exeptions herein contained.

The foregoing Resolution was introduced by Councilman Swan, who moved its adoption, which motion being duly seconded, was carried by the following vote:
