RESOLUTION NO. 218, N. S.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 53.

RESOLVED, that it is the intention of the Council of the City of Modesto to order the following work to be done and improvement to be made in said City, to-wit:-

That the alley between Fifteenth Street and Sixteenth Street from the northwest property line of "J" Street to the southeast property line of "K" Street, except all the intersections of streets and alleys and also excepting therefrom any of said work already done to the official grade, also excepting however, from all of the aforescribed work, such portions as are required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or corporation having railroad tracks thereon.

Be graded and thereupon paved to the official grade with asphalt concrete pavement four (4) inches in thickness, a foundation course two and one-half (2½) inches in thickness, and a wearing surface one and one-half (1½) inches in thickness, and curbed with redwood curbing. All of such grading, curbing and paving shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications heretofore adopted for doing said work, and now on file in the office of the City Clerk.

It is hereby further RESOLVED and determined by this Council, in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, approved April 7th, 1911, and acts amendatory thereof, or supplementary thereto, that serial bonds shall be issued to represent the expenses of said proposed work; said bonds shall be serial extending over a period of five years from the 2nd day of January next succeeding their date, and shall be issued to represent each assessment of twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, or more, remaining unpaid for the length of time specified in the statute in such cases made and provided in said Act of the Legislature of the State of California, approved April 7th, 1911, and acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto.

An even annual proportion of the principal sum thereof shall be payable by coupons on the second day of January of each year after their date, and until the whole is paid; and said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum on all sums unpaid until the whole of said principal and interest are paid; said interest to be paid semi-annually on the second day of January and July, respectively, of each and every year.

The City Clerk shall cause this Resolution of Intention to be published twice in the Modesto Evening News, a daily newspaper, published and circulated in said City and hereby designated for that purpose by the City Council.

The Street Superintendent shall immediately cause to be conspicuously posted along the line of said contemplated work and improvement, and in front of all property liable to be assessed, notices of the passage of this Resolution of Intention, in the manner and form required by law.

All the herein proposed work shall be done in pursuance of an act of the Legislature of the State of California, designated as the "Improvement Act of 1911", approved April 7th, 1911.

RESOLUTION ORDERING THE WORK, NO. 53.

RESOLVED, that whereas, the Council of the City of Modesto, did, on the 24th day of February, 1915, pass its Resolution of Intention No. 53, to order the hereinafter described work to be done and improvement to be made in said City, which Resolution of Intention was duly and legally published, as required by law, as appears from the affidavit of Modesto Evening News, now on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City; and

RESOLVED, that the public interest and convenience require the work herein described and the Council of the City of Modesto hereby orders the following work to be done in said City, to-wit:

That the Alley between FIFTEENTH STREET and SIXTEENTH STREET, from the northwest property line of "J" Street to the southeast property line of "K" Street, except all the intersections of streets and alleys and also excepting therefrom any of said work already done to the official grade, also excepting however, from all of the aforescribed work, such portions as are required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon.

Be graded and thereupon paved to the official grade with asphalt concrete pavement four (4) inches in thickness, a foundation course two and one-half ($2\frac{1}{2}$) inches in thickness, and a wearing surface one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) inches in thickness, and curbed with redwood curbing. RESOLUTION NO. 225, N. S.

PROVIDING FOR A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION IN AND FOR THE CITY OF MODESTO, AND A GENERAL SCHOOL ELECTION IN AND FOR THE MODESTO CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MODESTO AS FOLLOWS:

That under and pursuant to the Charter of the City of Modesto, a General Municipal Election, in and for the City of Modesto, and a General School Election, in and for the Modesto City School District, be, and the same is hereby called to be held on Tuesday, the 13th day of April, 1915, for the purpose of Electing the following officers for the said City of Modesto, to-wit:- One Mayor and two Councilmen; and also, for the purpose of electing certain officers for said Modesto City School District, to-wit:- Three members of the Board of Education of said Modesto City School District.

For the purpose of holding said election, said City of Modesto shall be, and the same is hereby precincted and established into six Special Election Precincts, to be known and designated as follows, to-wit:- SPECIAL PRECINCTS NO. 1, NO. 2, NO. 3, NO. 4, NO. 5, and NO. 6, respectively.

That the boundaries of said Special Precincts are hereby fixed and established as follows, to-wit:

All that portion of the City of Modesto east of the center line of the Central Pacific Railroad Track, and north of the center line of Needham Avenue, Annie Street and Cemetery Avenue is to be known as Special Precinct No. 1.

All that portion of the City of Modesto described as follows, to-wit:- Commencing at the intersection of the center line of Needham Avenue and the Central Pacific Railroad track, running thence to the intersection of "J" and 17th Streets; thence along the center line of "J" Street to 12th Street; thence along the center line of 12th Street to "I" Street; thence along the center line of "I" Street to the Central Pacific Railroad track; thence along the center line of the Central Pacific Railroad track to Needham Avenue, to be known as SPECIAL PRECINCT NO. 2.

All that portion of the City of Modesto described as follows, to-wit:- Commencing at the intersection of "I" Street with the Central Pacific Railroad track, running thence along the center line of "I" Street to 12th Street; thence along the center line of 12th Street to "J" Street; thence along the center line of "J" Street to 15th Street; thence along the center line of 15th Street to "G" Street; thence along the center line of "G" Street to the center line of the Central Pacific Railroad track; thence along the center line of said railroad track to "I" Street, to be known as SPECIAL PRECINCT NO. 3.

All that portion of the City of Modesto described as follows, to-wit:- Commencing at the intersection of the center line of the Central Pacific Railroad track and "G" Street; thence along "G" Street to 15th Street; thence along 15th Street to "J" Street; thence along "J" Street to Annie Street; thence along the center line of Annie Street to Cemetery Avenue; thence along the center line of Cemetery Avenue to the City Limits; thence along the City Limits to Dry Creek; thence along the center line of Dry Creek to the center line of the Tuolumne River; thence along the center line of the Tuolumne River to the Central Pacific Railroad track; thence along the center line of said railroad track to "G" Street, to be known as SPECIAL PRECINCT NO. 4.

All that portion of the City of Modesto bounded as follows:- Commencing at the intersection of the center line of "J" Street and Washington Streets; thence along the center line of Washington Street to Paradise Avenue; thence along the center line of Paradise Avenue to Franklin Street and the corporate limits; thence along the center line of Franklin Street and the corporate limits to the corner common to sections 31, 32, 5 and 6, townships 3 and 4, South range 9 east, M. D. B. & M., thence along line between sections 5 and 32, townships 3 and 4, range aforesaid, to the Tuolumne River; thence along the center line of the Tuolumne River to the center line of the Central Pacific Railroad track; thence along the center line of the Central Pacific Railroad track to "J" Street; thence along the center line of "J" Street to Washington Street; shall be known as SPECIAL PRECINCT NO. 5.

All that portion of the City of Modesto described as follows:- Commencing at the intersection of the center line of "J" Street and the Central Pacific Railroad track; running thence along the center line of said railroad track to the City Limits; thence south on City Limits to Franklin Street; thence along center line of Franklin Street to Paradise Avenue; thence along center line of Paradise Avenue to Washington Street; thence along the center line of Washington Street to "J" Street; thence along the center line of "J" Street to the center line of the Central Pacific Railroad track, shall be known as SPECIAL PRECINCT NO. 6.

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The boundaries of said Modesto City School District for the purpose of said election shall be as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the center of Section 24, Township 3 south, range 9 east, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian; thence west $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to quarter-corner between sections 22 and 23; thence north $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to northeast corner of section 22; thence west 2 miles to northwest corner of Section 21; thence north to Lateral No. 3 of the Modesto Irrigation District; thence westerly along Lateral No. 3 to its intersection with the east line of Section 18; thence north to quarter-corner on east line of section 18; thence west to center of Section 18; thence south $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to quarter-corner between Sections 18 and 19; thence west to the northwest corner of Section 19; thence south $\frac{3}{8}$ miles to quarter-corner between Section 30, Township three south, range 9 east, M. D. B. & M., and Section 25, Township 3 south, range 8 east; thence west $\frac{3}{4}$ Mile; thence south $\frac{1}{2}$ mile; thence east $\frac{3}{4}$ mile to southeast corner of Section 25, Township 3 south, range 8 east; thence south $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to quarter-corner east line of Section 36, Township 3 south, range 8 east; thence west to center of Section 36, Township 3 south, range 8 east; thence south $\frac{3}{4}$ mile to quarter-corner between the northeast quarter and the northwest quarter of Section 1, Township 4 south, range 8 east; thence west $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to quarter-quarter-corner in center of northwest quarter of Section 1, Township 4 south, range 8 east; thence south to

Tuolumne River; Thence easterly along center of river to its intersection with south line of Section 5, Township 4 south, range 9 east; thence east about 2½ miles to quarter-corner on south line of Section 3, Township 4 south, range 9 east; thence north to Tuolumne River; thence easterly along the center of river to its intersection with north and south quarter line in Section 2, Township 4 south, range 9 east; thence northerly through Section 2, Township 4 south, range 9 east, and Sections 35 and 26, Township 3 south, range 9 east to center of Dry Creek; thence easterly along center of Dry Creek to north and south quarter sectionline in Section 25, Township 3 south, range 9 east, M. D. B. & M.; thence north to center of Section 24, Township 3 south, range 9 east to place of beginning.

That "L" Street between the curb lines from the northeasterly property line of 7th Street northeasterly to the southwesterly property line of 9th Street, except all the intersections of Streets and Alleys, and also, excepting therefrom any of said work already done to the official grade also excepting, however, from all of the afore-described work such portions as are required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or corporation having Railroad tracks thereon,

be graded and thereupon paved to the official grade, with asphalt concrete pavement four (4) inches in thickness, a foundation course two and one-half (2½) inches in thickness, and a wearing surface one and one-half (1½) inches in thickness, and curbed with cement concrete curbing, and to further construct cement concrete gutters, and, all of such grading, paving, curbing and construction of gutters shall be done in accordance with plans and specifications heretofore adopted for doing said work, and now on file in the office of the City Clerk.

It is hereby further Resolved and determined by this Council that all public property owned or controlled by the City of Modesto fronting on the line of said contemplated improvement shall be included in the assessment and paid for out of the water fund.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED and DETERMINED by this Council, in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, approved April, 7th, 1911, and Acts amendatory thereof, or supplementary thereto, that serial bonds shall be issued to represent the expenses of said proposed work. Said Bonds shall be serial, extending over a period of five (5) years from the second day of January next succeeding their date, and shall be issued to represent each assessment of twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, or more, remaining unpaid for the length of time specified in the statute in such cases made and provided in said Act of the Legislature of the State of California, approved April 7th, 1911, and Acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto.

An even annual proportion of the principal sum thereof shall be payable by Coupons on the second day of January of each year after their date, and until the whole is paid; and said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum on all sums unpaid until the whole of said principal and interest are paid; said interest to be paid semi-annually on the second day of January and July, respectively, of each and every year.

The City Clerk shall cause this Resolution of Intention to be published twice in the Modesto Evening News, a daily newspaper, published and circulated in said City, and hereby designated for that purpose by the City Council.

The Street Superintendent shall immediately cause to be conspicuously posted along the line of said contemplated work and improvement, and in front of all property liable to be assessed, notices of the passage of this Resolution of Intention, in the manner and form required by law.

All the herein proposed work shall be done in pursuance of an act of the Legislature of the State of California, designated as the "Improvement Act of 1911," approved April 7th, 1911.
