All filth, garbage, rubbish or refuse of any kind, thrown or being in or upon any part of a Cistern, Street, or Alley, Public Square, or gutter, or in or upon any any place accustomed to be traveled by the Public, though not a public highway

Sec 2.  
All filth, garbage, rubbish, or refuse of any kind, thrown or being on any private premises where the same emits any noxious odor or is in any way prejudicial to the public health

Sec 3.  
Every privy, cesspool, sink or sewer, gutter or drain emitting any noxious odor or gas or effluvia, prejudicial to the public health, or in such condition, by reason of defective construction, or want of repair, as to be liable to emit such odor, gas, or effluvia

Sec 4.  
Every slaughter, house, and every carcass, of any dead animal except such as are killed, and kept for food,

Sec 5.  
All pools of stagnant water

Sec 6.  
Every business, trade or occupation, or act, by which any odor, gas or effluvia is created, and emitted to the public, or directly prejudicial, the public health

Sec 7<sup>th</sup> Every Culpod or excavation in any Street or Alley whether covered or otherwise any excavation on private property which is not closed by a substantial fence, except such as are expressly allowed by licence granted by the Board of Alders  
Sec 8<sup>th</sup>

Every obstruction in any part of any Street, Alley, sidewalk, gutter, or Cistern or in any place, though not a public highway through, or over which the public travel and every thing in such highway or place likely to hinder travel over the same dangerous,  
Sec 9<sup>th</sup>

All water which shall be caused or suffered to run across, or upon any sidewalk, Street or Alley in such a manner as to cause inconvenience to persons traveling on the same  
Sec 10<sup>th</sup>

All dry grass weeds, and other rubbish or thing standing or growing on private property or lots in said City and liable to ignite, and in danger the public safety  
Sec 11<sup>th</sup>

Every act or thing which necessarily and naturally produces annoyance, offense, or injury to the public  
Sec 12<sup>th</sup>

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, are hereby repealed,  
Sec 13<sup>th</sup>

This Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage.

Fifth Those who are estimated to make sales to the amount of one thousand dollars and less than two thousand dollars per month constitute the fifth class and must pay one dollar and fifty cents per month

Sixth Those who are estimated to make sales of less than one thousand dollars per month constitute the sixth class and must pay one dollar per month.
