PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

- Milt Trieweiler opposed outward expansion and urged the City to focus on higher-density infill development within existing boundaries. He stated this approach would better use existing infrastructure and avoid repeating past planning outcomes.
- Martha Kelly, representing the Stanislaus Sustainable Communities Coalition, requested an extension of the public comment period, citing limited opportunities for participation during December and January. She stated that additional time would support compliance with state requirements to reduce pollution and improve civic engagement, particularly for communities most impacted by environmental health issues.
- Edgar Garibay, speaking on behalf of Valley Improvement Projects and the Stanislaus Sustainable Communities Coalition, requested an extension of the public comment period for the General Plan land use scenarios. He raised concerns about outward growth and urged the City to prioritize reinvestment in existing neighborhoods, protect farmland, and support healthier and more equitable planning outcomes.
- Danielle Morgart, representing Assemblyman Juan Alanis, provided a legislative update noting the Legislature’s return to session. She highlighted two bills scheduled for hearings: AB 767, addressing the placement of sexually violent predators near schools and daycares, and AB 333, which updates recycling payment systems to reduce glass waste and support local recycling jobs.
- Lucas addressed several issues, including concerns about the effectiveness of the ZeroEyes system with existing city cameras and suggested piloting it at local schools. He also proposed using noise-detection cameras to address vehicle noise pollution and asked for general information regarding the construction timeline at the Coffee and Sylvan intersection.
- Carolyn Neumann encouraged residents to apply for the Stanislaus County Civil Grand Jury, noting it is a one-year commitment beginning July 1 with an average time requirement of about 20 hours per month. She directed interested individuals to the Stanislaus County Superior Court website for application details and interviews.

- Sebastian Jones spoke about his long-standing advocacy related to honoring Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., including renaming a park and proposing changes to how Dr. King is recognized on City facilities. He requested the City’s support in collaborating on statues honoring Dr. King and Cesar Chavez and exploring funding opportunities to advance those efforts.
- Jerry Thompson provided an update on the lowrider police car project, noting it is being restored by Modesto Junior College automotive students, who will earn course credit while gaining hands-on experience. They also shared updates on renovations at the Graffiti Museum, including a new radio studio and upcoming activities during Graffiti Week.
- Juan Telles thanked City staff for their public engagement efforts on the General Plan but expressed concern that the comment period during the holidays limited meaningful participation. He requested more time for community input and stated a preference for higher-density growth over outward sprawl, suggesting a hybrid approach to the proposed plans.

COUNCIL COMMENTS & REPORTS

- Councilmember Escutia-Braaton highlighted that this week is Human Trafficking Prevention Week and urged the community to remain vigilant, report suspicious activity, and treat all individuals with dignity and safety. She also recapped 2025 accomplishments in Modesto, including zero homicides, new affordable housing and shelter projects, approval of a USL soccer stadium, and the finalization of the Strategic Plan, emphasizing continued focus on public safety, housing, and sustainable economic growth in 2026.
- Vice-Mayor Williams wished everyone a Happy New Year and recognized recent local awards, including the Excellence in Public Safety award to Chief Gillespie and the American Legion Post 74 Citizen of the Year and Community Hero awards. He also

highlighted upcoming Martin Luther King Day events, including a luncheon hosted by the King-Kennedy Board and a program at Christian Love Baptist Church.

- Councilmember Wright thanked the police department for their efforts in maintaining public safety and noted the city’s interest in high-density housing. He explained that the main challenge is attracting developers for affordable high-rise projects and highlighted upcoming projects, including a five-story apartment complex on Seventh Street.
- Councilmember Ricci expressed concerns about Stanislaus Animal Services, citing ineffective programs, poor customer service, and budget issues, and urged community members to attend the strategic planning meeting on Thursday, January 15. He also highlighted excitement for the upcoming Modesto Roadsters baseball season and praised the Parks Department for ongoing lighting upgrades and upcoming projects at several local parks.
- Councilmember Alvarez highlighted the City’s 2025 accomplishments, including a historic reduction in violent crime with zero homicides, infrastructure improvements funded through Measure L, and housing and homelessness initiatives. He emphasized the importance of continuing these efforts in 2026 with transparency, fiscal responsibility, and a focus on outcomes that positively impact residents’ daily lives.
- Mayor Zwahlen recapped several community events from December and early January, including the Modesto Garden Club table viewing, a City Hall caroling event, the General Plan meeting at Harvest Hall, and the McHenry Mansion Candlelight Tour. She highlighted the Modesto Roadsters baseball team announcement, community service at the Modesto Gospel Mission, the launch of Hope Works, and the ribbon-cutting for American Family Care Urgent Care, emphasizing that public engagement leads to meaningful action in the city.

- Dean Richardson encouraged continued investment in the Forestry Division to support Modesto’s Tree City USA designation and City beautification goals. He also urged the City Council to advance improvements to the Tuolumne River Regional Park and approve related budget recommendations.
- Tom Myers advocated for allocating Measure H and other funds to improve the Tuolumne River Regional Park, citing an approved five-year plan and long-standing funding needs. He emphasized that continued upgrades would increase accessibility, awareness, and recreational use, helping connect surrounding neighborhoods and strengthen the park’s role as a City asset.
- Mohamed Rashid raised a safety concern regarding uneven sidewalks in downtown Modesto, specifically near 11th and I Street, after experiencing a fall.
- Hilary Moak encouraged the City Council to invest in the Tuolumne River Regional Park as a way to support neighborhood pride, downtown revitalization, and economic development goals. She highlighted the park’s ecological value, recreational opportunities, and potential to serve as a regional destination supported by Measure H funding.
- Milt Trierweiler urged the City Council to make long-term, responsible land-use decisions that protect agricultural land and natural resources for future generations. They opposed proposed sprawl and recommended focusing growth on infill and redevelopment within existing urban areas rather than expanding outward.
- Chris Guptill described extensive volunteer involvement and advisory work supporting the Tuolumne River Regional Park and emphasized that volunteer efforts have reached

their limits. They urged the City Council to support proposed investments to improve access, parking, and maintenance, noting that data and community input support making the park a true regional destination.

- Juan Telles urged investment in the Tuolumne River Regional Park due to its connection to underserved neighborhoods. He also recommended expanding citywide tree canopy goals, particularly in West and South Modesto, to improve climate resilience, air quality, and public health.

- Charles R. Evins II, a past Master of Silver Square Lodge 66 in Modesto, addressed the Mayor and City Council to request that the Prince Hall-affiliated Grand Lodge of California be given the opportunity to lay the cornerstone in ancient form at the new King Kennedy Center.
- Derek Castle praised the City of Modesto's Bridge Housing program but noted limited progress due to reliance on donated land. He urged the City to improve the program by increasing community awareness, convening local leaders to identify sites, considering the use of City-owned land, and allowing staff to lease or purchase property so the program can better serve the unhoused population.
- Juan Rosales of District Council 16 International Union of Painters and Allied Trades addressed the approved contract amendment for HB Restoration, citing the company's history of wage theft judgments, OSHA safety violations, and the lack of competitive bidding as the contract expanded to over \$1.5 million. He urged the Council to suspend further payments, audit the vendor's labor and safety compliance, and strengthen oversight to ensure fiscal accountability, worker protection, and responsible use of public funds.
- TJ Gardner II, a certified coatings inspector and application specialist, expressed concerns about expanding the HB Restoration contract to additional wastewater and potable water facilities. He emphasized the need for contractors with proven qualifications and experience in highly sensitive and corrosive environments, noting past observations that raised questions about HB Restoration's ability to meet specialized coating standards and protect critical City assets.
- Nathan Alonzo of Pacific Gas and Electric provided an update announcing residential rate reductions, including a 3–5% decrease for gas customers, reflecting PG&E's affordability efforts. He also noted ongoing coordination with the City of Modesto to align infrastructure work and expressed interest in returning later in the year to share further company and local project updates.
- Sebastian Jones urged the City Council to display Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s full name, stating it is a long-standing issue of respect and recognition, especially ahead of Black History Month. He also advocated for statues honoring Dr. King and Cesar Chavez, seeking the City's permission and partnership to make them a reality, and emphasized his years of dedication to these efforts.
- Michael Masuda introduced himself to the Council as a candidate for California's 5th Congressional District, sharing his background in the region and public service. He

emphasized the need to address affordability, housing, healthcare, and national division, and stated his commitment to locally driven solutions and working with Modesto leaders to bring federal resources back to the community.

- Kevin McClarty alerted the Council to a misaligned “no left turn” sign at the J Street, Downey, and McHenry intersection, noting it has been pointing the wrong direction for months and could unfairly confuse drivers. He urged the City to notify the state, which oversees the highway, and suggested that any tickets issued due to the unclear signage should be dismissed.
- Emmanuel, owner of HB Restoration, introduced himself and his company, explaining its history since 2013 and experience completing painting and restoration projects for cities, districts, and school systems across California. He emphasized his long-standing workforce, commitment to paying employees, addressing issues when they arise, and encouraged the City to review the company’s references and past work.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

- Danielle Morgart, representing Assemblyman Juan Alanis’s office, provided a Legislative Update. She reported that Assemblyman Alanis has introduced eight bills so far. Two recently introduced bills include AB 1765, which proposes a fee waiver for disabled veteran license plates, and AB 1814, which would expand field sobriety test training for police officers assigned to traffic enforcement duties. She concluded by offering the office’s assistance with legislative questions or issues involving state agencies.

- Lucas proposed a potential change to the City’s Waste Management System. He submitted a letter requesting that the City review and consider a pilot contract with TerraCycle to address items not typically recyclable within existing waste streams. He stated that the program could help reduce blight, remove unwanted garbage from transportation infrastructure, and lower carbon emissions. He acknowledged the need to comply with State, Federal, and Municipal regulations, as well as budgetary and procurement standards. He noted that while the program would not eliminate most plastic waste by weight, it could capture a significant portion of non-recyclable plastic packaging that currently lacks a recycling pathway. He asked the City to evaluate the proposal, consider whether a public discussion is appropriate, and provide guidance on next steps or available public resources.
- Julianne Phillips provided a Legislative update on behalf of Senator Alvarado-Gil's office, she stated that the most pressing legislative issue generating calls is AB 1421, which would extend the study of a per-mile tax. The bill has moved to the Senate, and Senator Alvarado-Gil has issued a statement expressing opposition to it. She also shared recent district activities, including two meet-and-greet events held in Salida and Riverbank. She announced upcoming mobile office hours in Modesto at the Law Library on February 26 from 10 a.m. to noon to assist constituents with State Agency matters. She added that she hopes to host additional mobile office hours in March ahead of a future Council meeting.
- Sebastian Jones expressed appreciation and apologized if any past remarks had caused offense. He acknowledged prior disagreements but called for unity moving forward. He advocated for installing statues of Cesar Chavez and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. at a new soccer or baseball field, stating that such a project would honor their legacies and create a lasting historical impact for the City. He mentioned having gathered over 5,000 signatures in support of related efforts in the past and emphasized the potential to seek Federal funding connected to Dr. King’s legacy. He called for a coalition of community members and Council support to move the proposal forward, encouraging collaboration and setting aside differences. He concluded by expressing faith-based sentiments, appreciation for the Council, and hope that the project would leave a meaningful legacy for future generations.
- Harlan Divan commended the Council for their roles in recent community initiatives, including the award for Jenny’s Place and the development of Hope Works, a United Way and Gospel Mission project. She noted an upcoming ribbon-cutting event for Hope Works and expressed appreciation for the Council’s involvement. She also brought attention to Stockton’s recently passed “Compassionate City Resolution,” adopted on January 13. She explained that the resolution differs from a sanctuary city designation and does not create new policies, but instead restates existing city policies related to immigrant protections, such as not reporting immigration status when residents call 911 and not holding individuals solely on civil immigration holds. She said the resolution affirms respect for federal law and the role of immigration authorities while emphasizing community protections. She stated that similar resolutions are being considered or adopted in other cities and described the issue as

timely, citing concerns within immigrant communities. She encouraged the Modesto City Council to review the resolution and consider taking similar action and said she would provide additional information by email.

- Todd distributed walnuts from his family’s farm in Wood Colony and briefly shared the history of his family’s farming presence in the area, dating back to 1905. He then addressed recent discussion and media coverage regarding Wood Colony and potential disputes about its definition and boundaries. Referring to a historical book available to the City, he explained that Wood Colony began with an original 1,760-acre tract, known as the Wood Tract, but argued that this acreage represented only the beginning of the colony’s development. Citing specific pages from the book, he noted references to the expansion of the name beyond the original acreage, the development of additional parcels, and historical figures associated with the area. He suggested that Wood Colony encompasses more than the initial 1,760 acres and encouraged the Council to review the historical text for a fuller understanding. He concluded by offering to return with additional information.
- Kevin McClarty thanked City staff member Patrick Crowley for designating two parking spaces and installing a bench at the Modesto Airport for individuals who wish to observe planes taking off and landing. He explained that after Tesla leased the entire parking lot, he raised concerns about the lack of public parking. In response, the City reserved two spaces for plane observers. He expressed appreciation for the City’s responsiveness to residents.

COUNCIL COMMENTS & REPORTS

- Vice Mayor Williams reported on a recent MLK event hosted by MJC and the Modesto Peace/Life Center. The keynote speaker was Dr. Shabazz, one of Malcolm X's six daughters, who spoke about her father's legacy and her family's experiences. He described the event as positive and expressed appreciation for her visit to Modesto. He also recognized recipients of the MLK Legacy Award. Odessa Johnson, noted as the first African American in her role within Modesto City Schools, was acknowledged for her service and is now retired and living in Los Angeles. Additionally, he shared that Gladys Williams, a past MLK Legacy Award recipient, former MTA member, past NAACP president, and community advocate, passed away on November 27. Her service will be held on February 20 at 11:00 a.m. at Revival Church, 825 Seventh Street. He also announced that three new police officers were recently sworn in and offered congratulations to them. He also shared that he attended a biennial quilt show in Modesto, typically attended by the Mayor. The event featured approximately 200 quilts, along with additional quilt-related displays and vendors, and was held at the car museum over two days. He described the event as well organized and well attended. He noted that the selected quilt award recipient had never previously won and became emotional upon receiving the recognition, expressing gratitude to the Mayor and the City for hosting the event. Vice Mayor Williams also noted that February is Black History Month and highlighted several upcoming events, mentioning that the council would not meet again before some of them occur. He announced that Sankofa, Modesto's first African American theater company, will celebrate its 13th year with a production titled Perilous Victorious at the Gallo Center from February 12 through 14. He encouraged the community to attend and support the performances. He also shared that a Black History Month program will be held at the Senior Center on February 28 at 5:00 p.m., possibly with a donation requested.
- Council Member Ricci provided several updates and comments. He announced that, thanks to a State grant, a mural will be installed in an alley off 10th and J Street to

improve a struggling downtown area. He expressed hope that the city, in coordination with the Fire Department, could also create safe event spaces in the area to support cultural activities, gatherings, music, food, and art. He then recognized a new neighborhood being developed in Modesto that honors firefighters who served the community, thanking DR. Horton, the Modesto Fire Department, and the city for this memorial project. Finally, he addressed a governance issue involving MID, noting that the board had previously voted to stop investigating alleged water abuse issues related to a board member, who had also voted against the investigation. He reported that the California Fair Political Practices Commission agreed to review potential issues with that vote and emphasized the importance of transparency and impartiality in government.

- Council Member Escutia-Bratton shared updates on recent developments in healthcare within Modesto. She noted attending the ribbon-cutting for a new Kaiser Medical facility in District One, which provides adult and pediatric care, includes a pharmacy, and employs nearly 400 people. She reflected on Modesto's history as a medical hub and highlighted other recent projects, including the \$380 million Memorial Cancer Center, which employs over 5,600 people. She also emphasized that these facilities address the community's need for accessible, affordable medical services, provide job opportunities, and contribute to the local economy. She expressed gratitude to medical professionals and the institutions investing in the area and reaffirmed the importance of continuing to strengthen healthcare services in Modesto.
- Mayor Zwahlen provided several community updates and reflections. She noted attending two recent police academy graduations, including one in Stockton with Council Member Wright, and greeting new Modesto Police Department officers and other City employees during a City Hall tour. She also attended Stanislaus State University's Spring 2026 welcome address, praising the campus, students, and the university president, Britt Rios-Ellis, for a well-organized event. Additionally, she participated in a City Ministry Network meeting, where residents gather monthly to discuss city and county issues, highlighting a report from Marianne Cannon on the Community Foundation. She also emphasized the active engagement of residents in community activities and highlighted upcoming events, including: the Colorado Rouse groundbreaking for infrastructure projects, the Hope Works ribbon-cutting, Modesto's Night to Shine event, and the Dryden Clubhouse groundbreaking on February 17. She concluded by noting the many positive developments and community initiatives are taking place in Modesto.

After seeing drone programs in other cities, he said drones could respond quickly to 911 calls, monitor crowds, provide night vision recording, and potentially reduce costs. He encouraged the Council to review the plane's expenses and explore using drones as a more efficient, future-focused alternative.
- Derek Castle, speaking for local neighborhood and running groups, urged the Council to address dangerous e-bike speeds on the Dry Creek and Virginia Corridor trails. He shared examples of two community members who were

seriously injured after being struck by speeding cyclists. While supportive of e-bikes, he asked the City to adopt an Ordinance similar to Oakland's, limiting bikes to 5 mph when passing pedestrians, saying it would be a simple, low-cost way to improve safety and prevent further injuries.

- Vice-Mayor Williams announced several upcoming Black History Month events, including an ongoing African American history exhibit at the local museum through March 12. He also highlighted a clergy-focused Black History Month program hosted by the Cesar Chavez Committee and another program by the King Kennedy Board, both taking place this week, with requested donations to attend.
- Councilmember Ricci addressed two major issues: the long-standing and costly problem of county pockets, which he said could take decades more to resolve without new financing tools to help homeowners fund infrastructure upgrades, and concerns about the animal shelter. He criticized the shelter's recent fee recommendations as disconnected from operational realities and urged immediate action to address ongoing issues such as spay and neuter services and intake capacity.
- Councilmember Alvarez highlighted a \$30 million investment in infrastructure improvements for the Colorado Rouse neighborhood, bringing sidewalks, ADA upgrades, and water quality improvements to the area. He also recognized the City's partnership with Modesto Gospel Mission and United Way to launch the Hope Works program, providing transitional employment for up to 68 individuals facing homelessness. Lastly, he announced an upcoming Community Connect event hosted by El Concilio and South Modesto Business United.
- Councilmember Bavaro advised that his District 4 Advisory Committee will be touring the Real Time Crime Center at the Modesto police Department followed by a briefing from the Police Chief on 2025 crime reduction.
- Councilmember Escutia-Bratton highlighted recent events celebrating Modesto's firefighters and police, praising their dedication, professionalism, and commitment to public safety, and welcomed seven new police recruits to the community.
- Mayor Zwahlen reported on several community activities, including touring county transportation projects like Colorado Rouse and Paradise Road, highlighting safety improvements and thanking Senator Susan Eggman for funding support. She spoke to Downey High School students, attended the Tim Tebow Foundation's Night to Shine prom for special needs residents, and participated in a police promotion ceremony. She also announced the groundbreaking for Seventh Street Village on February 26th.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

- Milt Trieweiler, a lifelong Stanislaus County resident, emphasized the responsibility of public officials to make rational, forward-looking decisions that protect Modesto's unique farmland and natural resources for future generations. He urged the City to reject the 2050 sprawl proposals and instead pursue high-density infill development using existing infrastructure to accommodate growth sustainably without increasing taxes or repeating past planning failures.
- Terhesa Gamboa announced an upcoming Woodland West neighborhood watch meeting to discuss community issues, including growth, and invited the public to attend. She supports preserving the rich agricultural soil in Wood Colony, stating that further development should be avoided to protect this unique resource.
- Pedro Meza stated that he traveled to Modesto to inform City representatives that a Save Mart contractor replaced a long-standing unionized janitorial workforce with a non-union cleaning company. He explains that this change resulted in the loss of union representation, health benefits, and wages, and he asks City officials to encourage the company to restore those employment conditions.
- Jesus Barrios stated that he traveled from Concord to Modesto to reiterate concerns about Save Mart contractors replacing a unionized janitorial workforce with a non-union company after decades of service. He explains that this change resulted in reduced wages, limited benefits, and loss of job protections, and he asks local officials to coordinate with other cities and counties to address the situation affecting him and his coworkers.
- Mark Sharwood, a vice president of SEIU United Service Workers West, explained that the union represents janitors who have cleaned local supermarkets for decades and raises concerns about recent contractor changes affecting those workers. He asks the City Council to consider actions to address the issue, noting that comparable stores such as Safeway maintain union contracts and benefits, and that Save Mart, which is based in Modesto, could do the same.
- Lydia and Lincoln Bertram introduced themselves as members of the Institute for Cultural Communicators, which teaches public speaking. They stated that they are attending the City Council meeting as part of an assignment for their group and thanked the City Council for the opportunity to come and observe the meeting.
- Alex Garcia, a political organizer for SEIU United Service Workers West, addressed the City Council regarding Save Mart Supermarkets. He explained that the company replaced a long-standing union janitorial contract with a non-union contractor, resulting in reduced wages and loss of health benefits, and asked the Council to encourage Save Mart to return to a union contractor that honors the previous collective bargaining agreement.
- Jerry Thompson, stated that he reviewed the questionnaire at the StanCOG table outside the Chambers and found it informative and educational. He noted that it

focuses on building within the City rather than urban sprawl, suggesting adaptive reuse of existing buildings for housing and mixed-use development, and recommended others review the questionnaire and its options.

COUNCIL COMMENTS & REPORTS

- Vice Mayor Williams announced an upcoming Women’s Month celebration on the 26th at the DoubleTree Hotel, highlighting women in construction, including Mrs. Carol, who has operated a women-owned business for over 60 years. He also acknowledges his wife in honor of the occasion.
- Councilmember Ricci addressed several local issues, noting traffic safety concerns at the Carpenter and Briggsmore intersection, and urging adjustments to improve safety. He also addressed the reductions in janitorial contracts at Save Mart that affect wages, benefits, and pensions. He also called for regulations to address safety concerns with bike takeovers and increasing e-bike use on trails.
- Councilmember Bavaro addressed three topics: a recent tour of the Real-Time Crime Center with District Four residents, safety concerns related to e-bikes on trails, and the impact of reduced wages and lost benefits for local employees. He noted that when employers cut benefits, costs may shift to public programs, and he emphasized the importance of providing living wages and benefits to prevent financial hardship and homelessness among workers.
- Councilmember Alvarez noted that the City has limited authority over private companies like Save Mart, but emphasized that the company’s decision to reduce wages and benefits impacts workers, the local economy, and public resources. He also highlighted ongoing local projects, including the Seventh Street Village mixed-use affordable housing development and the Dryden Park Golf Course Clubhouse renovation, and concluded with condolences for the passing of veteran and community advocate Basilio Basel Jr.
- Councilmember Wright praised the police department for reducing crime and highlighted the recent installation of red-light cameras to improve intersection safety. He also emphasized the importance of ensuring that new housing is paired with quality local jobs and affordable transportation to support the community and reduce commuting.

- Councilmember Escutia-Braaton announced that she would be in Sacramento the following day participating in Valley Voice, meeting with Assembly members and Senators from eight Central Valley counties. She stated that the delegation would address issues including air quality, safety, mobility, transit funding, and passenger rail, aiming to secure resources and funding to benefit Modesto and the broader Central Valley.
- Mayor Zwahlen reported on the third annual Black History Month celebration hosted by the Cesar Chavez Community Celebration Committee and attended the Larry Dean Crom End of Watch Memorial flag-raising honoring fallen police officers. She also addressed traffic safety measures, noting recent changes to intersections, emphasizing enforcement to prevent crashes, and acknowledging the work of law enforcement and firefighters in responding to incidents.
