

**Final Report of the Blue Ribbon Commission on Homelessness  
September 1, 2011**

In February of 2011, nine citizens were selected from a pool of 32 applicants by the Safety and Communities sub-committee of the Modesto City Council to serve on the ad hoc Blue Ribbon Commission on Homelessness. The Commission was charged with a 6 month task to research homelessness in Modesto and nationwide, including the needs and services for the homeless, and the needs and services for businesses and neighborhoods. The goal given to the Commission, in view of diminishing resources and budgets, was to provide the City Council actionable ideas for improving the quality of life for all Modesto citizens. The mission statement was adopted as: “To improve the lives of all Modestoans by combating chronic, long-term homelessness through better utilization of city and community resources.”

Homelessness and poverty involve many structural social issues beyond the scope of the Commission (such as economics, education, health-care, and transportation), so the first step was to narrow the task down to manageable ideas. This process included interviews, public comment, informal polling, information gathering, research, fieldwork and field trips to gain necessary background knowledge. Over many months, several issues rose to the top to become the following recommendations from the Commission:

- Enhanced Outreach and Homeless Placement
- Development of a Public Education program
- Improvement of Services Coordination and Information
- Dedicated Resources for Park Safety and Security
- Establishment of a Day Center

ENHANCED OUTREACH AND HOMELESS PLACEMENT: Lessons learned about homelessness have finally been incorporated into federal and state policies which can be simply stated as: Housing First.<sup>1</sup> HUD and VA programs assisting the Homeless have modified their programs to reflect this and they will require the city to follow them when using their funds. With or without their funds, it has proven to be the superior moral and economic solution and the Commission recommends the city adopt a Housing First model.

The main focus when we speak of the Homeless are the Chronic Homeless<sup>2</sup> and Homeless Veterans. When we speak of housing, it is Supportive Housing, meaning all the support one needs to improve their quality of life is available to the person (e.g., medical, rehab, etc.).

In order to reach this population, which numbers 236 in Stanislaus County according to the January 2011 HUD Point-In-Time Homeless count,<sup>3</sup> we recommend using the 100,000 Homes Model.<sup>4</sup> This model uses a vulnerability assessment survey to identify the Homeless most vulnerable to death, if not housed very soon. Research shows this population often consumes a disproportionate amount of community resources (e.g., emergency rooms, ambulance rides, incarceration, etc.). Using the vulnerability survey information provides another data point for service providers to give a higher priority for placement. It does not call for any additional housing or support services.

We also recommend having outreach events, which would be conducted at least once and preferably twice each year. These events provide a single location where community volunteers, health service and homeless assistance providers connect homeless persons with critical resources like food; medical and dental care; DMV identification forms; employment services and placement; vulnerability surveys conducted; mental health and drug counseling referrals; haircuts; wheel chair repairs; et cetera. These events, commonly called “Project Homeless Connect Days,”<sup>5</sup> could be held at the Day Center or other suitable facility.

DEVELOPMENT OF A PUBLIC EDUCATION PROGRAM: Conduct a robust public information and education campaign to outline what services are available to the Homeless, how services can best be provided, and how citizens can help by becoming part of the larger coordinated effort and partnering with organizations to end homelessness. Citizens should be informed that chronic homelessness in particular requires long term sophisticated support, and that direct contributions to panhandlers generally prolongs their vulnerability to homelessness, addiction, and death. An example of an effort to channel money from panhandlers to housing is Fresno’s First Steps Home Program.<sup>6</sup> The program has proven very successful in Fresno and other cities, and should be considered for implementation in Modesto.

IMPROVEMENT OF SERVICES COORDINATION AND INFORMATION: The population of Stanislaus County and the city of Modesto is very fortunate to have many dedicated organizations as well as individuals working to improve the quality of life for those in need.<sup>7</sup> Because each organization has its own mission and operational procedures, and since there is no overall coordinating body, a potential for improvement exists in at least two key areas.

Financial Tracking of Services – Currently, no organization is charged with tracking the costs of homeless services across the myriad of providers. We recommend the city and the county investigate the use of a common cost tracking system to collaborate and prioritize together in order to ensure the most effective use of their limited funding to assist the Homeless.

Information Sharing – There are hundreds of organizations, consisting of for-profit, non-profit, faith-based, as well federal, state, county and city governments that process information about their services and clients. At a minimum, it is recommended there be a single location, such as a website, where community volunteers, social service providers, service clubs and faith-based organizations collaborate and share up-to-date information to serve homeless persons and those at risk of becoming homeless. This information effort should result in solving one of the true defects in services—which is that no comprehensive publication is produced regularly enough that contains all of the assistance available throughout the city. The United Way 211 service and HUD’s Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) are two systems that could possibly be adapted to fulfill this need.

We also strongly recommend the city and county establish a coordinating body. This could be a change to a charter of an existing body, such as the Continuum of Care, or the creation of a new one. Additionally to be considered is the establishment of a county/city Homeless Prevention and Policy Manager position. The city of Fresno has such a position and a job description<sup>8</sup> is given for your reference. Improved management, enhanced policies and procedures, information sharing and better coordination will help reduce service redundancies as well as improve service delivery. These actions will also ensure monies are spent where they have the greatest impact on providing essential homeless services.

DEDICATED RESOURCES FOR PARK SAFETY AND SECURITY: The Commission studied complaints related to the conditions of city parks (safety, drug and alcohol abuse, public meals that require costly clean-up, and unsanitary conditions when public restrooms are not available). Upon review, the Commission concluded that the city Municipal Code has a

comprehensive set of regulations that adequately address abuse of park facilities. Moreover, Stanislaus County has comprehensive health regulations governing the preparation, distribution and serving of food to the general public. These existing laws and regulations provide thorough protection for the health and safety of all citizens, but the need for regular enforcement was a common difficulty for many cities.

To ensure these laws are effective, the Commission recommends the city consider the following options:

- The use of “Park Service Officers.” The Commission reviewed an existing program in the City of Santa Maria<sup>9</sup> which involves the use of Park Service Officers who ensure safety at city parks and facilities. V.I.P. volunteers might assist these officers.
- The use of “Code Enforcement Officers.” The city of Merced has found this to be very effective in addressing homelessness, both as advocates and code enforcement. This frees up the police for criminal activities. V.I.P. volunteers might assist these officers.
- The Modesto Police Department re-establish the top ten list of habitual (homeless) offenders and seek the funding to support this initiative. The police officers assigned to the habitual offender program could then closely coordinate with park safety efforts.

Several neighborhood associations in Modesto are exploring the possibility of contracting with private security services to patrol neighborhoods and parks. The presence of a park service or code enforcement officers, combined with V.I.P. volunteers and private security personnel, would bring safety and reduce crime and vandalism to heavily used parks.<sup>10</sup> City staff indicated the cost of park maintenance issues related to crime, vandalism, and homelessness is greater than \$500,000 per year. The city of Modesto has no crime statistics related to homelessness, but it should be noted that police and Parks and Recreation employees do not consider the Homeless to be the perpetrators of most vandalism or criminal activities in our parks.

The Commission recommends the city explore collaborating with neighborhood associations to determine which model, if any, is the best approach for Modesto. The potential exists that a reduction in park maintenance costs would more than offset the cost of dedicated resources for park security and safety.

ESTABLISHMENT OF A DAY CENTER: An issue that came to the forefront was the lack of a central facility open during the day to homeless persons. Such a facility, or facilities, would help to more efficiently and effectively provide services. Regardless of where the center is located, it should provide proper food serving facilities, showers, laundry facilities, and hand washing

facilities. These drop-in centers could utilize volunteers and/or community organizations to provide staffing and also meals for homeless persons. During the day it could serve as a homeless services and referral resource center. These centers also provide the Homeless with something to do during the day. A major comment from the Homeless was: "Give us something to do during the day."

## CONCLUSION

The Blue Ribbon Committee has provided these recommendations with few implementation details due to the limited time charter and resources of the Commission. The Commission recommends that an implementation committee be formed to study our recommendations and quickly decide which recommendations can go forward now and others that need more research.

## Appendix A

### Housing First

From Wikipedia: **Housing First**, also known as "rapid re-housing", is a relatively recent innovation in human service programs and social policy regarding treatment of the homeless and is an alternative to a system of emergency shelter/transitional housing progressions. Rather than moving homeless individuals through different "levels" of housing, known as the Continuum of Care, whereby each level moves them closer to "independent housing" (for example: from the streets to a public shelter, and from a public shelter to a transitional housing program, and from there to their own apartment in the community) Housing First moves the homeless individual or household immediately from the streets or homeless shelters into their own apartments.

Housing First approaches are based on the concept that a homeless individual or household's first and primary need is to obtain stable housing, and that other issues that may affect the household can and should be addressed once housing is obtained. In contrast, many other programs operate from a model of "housing readiness" — that is, that an individual or household must address other issues that may have led to the episode of homelessness prior to entering housing.

### **As Registry Week Ends, Work of Housing the Homeless Begins**

Compelling Data Emerges as 92 Volunteers Complete 285 Surveys of Local Homeless

*One Local Homeless Veteran Leaves His Shanty for Emergency Housing **This Week***

Ninety-two local volunteers canvassed an area bounded by Ventura, Santa Fe, San Benito, Monterey, Santa Clara, and the Hwy 99 off ramp in the early morning hours to create a detailed registry of the homeless population in the vicinity. This local partnership called Project P4: People, Place, Public, & Partnerships are a partner in the national 100,000 Homes Campaign. The 285 surveys of homeless individuals helped identify the target area's most vulnerable. The data will be used to realign existing housing and other care resources to prioritize delivery of services to the most vulnerable homeless in our community. The importance of partnerships is supported by the story of a local homeless veteran who was surveyed on Monday and vacated his shanty by Wednesday, moving into emergency housing, provided by the local Department of Veterans Affairs as he awaits his VASH voucher from the Fresno Housing Authority. At 72



years old, Mr. Sawaba, a Vietnam Veteran, has encountered several episodes of homelessness over the past 7 years along with several visits to the Emergency Room.

“Registry Week was hands down a success and Fresno now has a common bond and common goal with 86 other communities in the nation,” said local campaign manager Angie Nguyen, of the Housing Authorities of the City & County of Fresno and Chair of the Fresno-Madera Continuum of Care. “Many of our volunteers do not work in social services so this experience has increased their awareness of homelessness. We now have 92 citizens in our community who can help others better understand the real issues surrounding homelessness. They are walking away with something that can’t be taught but can only be learned through experience.”

Volunteers gathered data using the **Vulnerability Index**, a questionnaire utilized by the 100,000 Homes Campaign. Volunteer teams captured data on health status, institutional history (jail, prison, hospital, and military), and length of homelessness, to name a few. In the coming months, **Project P4** will use this data to identify the most vulnerable members of the region’s homeless population and prioritize them for permanent housing. Nationally, this approach saves lives and an average of \$30,000 dollars per person in publicly funded services. The same analysis will be done locally in the coming months.

The Vulnerability Index is based on research by Dr. Jim O’Connell of Harvard University, which shows that certain medical conditions place homeless individuals at much higher risk of death than members of the general population facing identical conditions. Overall, 35% of the target area’s homeless were identified as vulnerable and at increased risk of death.

Of the 285 homeless individuals surveyed in Project P4’s first Registry Week target area, 100 homeless individuals qualified as vulnerable by this standard.

Information about other health conditions were also factored into the vulnerability rating such as cancer, diabetes, brain injuries, Tuberculosis, and Hepatitis C. If deemed untreated, a person’s morbidity risk increases.

#### **Public Safety and Outreach**

Increased outreach is successfully moving people off the streets and into services, and it's reducing panhandling and other loitering.

- **2-1-1 Phone Number**

2-1-1 is a toll-free number provided by the United Way. Individuals can dial 2-1-1 or 1-866-559-4211 anytime — 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year — from anywhere in Fresno County to quickly get connected to community resources if they are homeless or are facing homelessness. The call is free and confidential. Operators are trained specialists with multiple language skills: English, Spanish, Lao, Thai, Khmer, and over 140 other languages.

- **2-1-1 Cards**

Donating a dollar to someone on the street corner often extends homelessness. Donating that same dollar to Fresno First Steps Home helps end homelessness. We provide an alternative to giving cash by providing 2-1-1 cards to residents via businesses and online. The card provides information to homeless individuals to help them on the path back to a stable home.

#### **Homeless Prevention and Policy-Manager**

Responsibilities including but not limited to:

- Day to day oversight of Homeless Prevention and Policy issues in the City of Fresno
- Develop goals and benchmarks on behalf of the City (and County) of Fresno adopted Ten-Year-Plan to End Chronic Homelessness September 9, 2008 as a foundation
- Develop, implement and manage, programs and policies designed to prevent and end chronic homelessness in the City (and County) of Fresno
- Initiates, cultivates, develops and maintains effective working relationships in order to implement the goals and objectives outlined in the City (and County) of Fresno Ten-Year-Plan to End Chronic Homelessness, including City and County of Fresno officials, service providers, community groups, and the public
- Participates in strategic management efforts to reduce homelessness by formulating and communicating a vision of the City of Fresno's effort to end chronic homelessness
- Develops and contextualizes strategies for issue management; identifies vital information; identifies and lobbies key decision-makers
- Researches and analyzes homelessness and related issues in the City of Fresno and reports findings
- Represents the City of Fresno on special committees, commissions, and projects related to addressing chronic homelessness in the city of Fresno
- Directs and manages the office by ensuring that activities are in compliance with operating procedures and policies; administers the annual operating budget; supervises personnel; sets and communicates priorities; motivates and directs the activities of the employees
- Ability to promote the vision, mission and goals for development of the city of Fresno's program to end chronic homelessness and garner input from key decision-makers and stakeholders
- Ability to provide strong leadership in developing and implementing programs and serve as the staff in support of the Leadership Council
- Serves as key spokesperson on communicating City's vision to end homelessness; serves as a focal point of homelessness information for residents as well as service providers



## Appendix G

### City of Santa Maria Park Service Officer Job Description

CITY OF SANTA MARIA NOVEMBER 2006

PARK SERVICES OFFICER II

#### DEFINITION

Under the direction of the Senior Park Services Officer, patrols City parks and public facilities; enforces applicable City ordinances, government codes, and state laws relating to the use of parks and public facilities in the City; may oversee the day-to-day work of the Park Services Aide(s), performs skilled maintenance; and performs other duties as assigned.

#### DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

The Park Services Officer II must exercise independent judgment effectively; patrol and perform enforcement duties with minimal oversight; may perform limited semi-skilled duties; and the incumbent may supervise, train and assign the program staff.

#### DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Duties may include, but are not limited to the following:

Patrols City owned or operated parks, community centers, play fields, joint use school/park sites, public parking lots, landscaped rights of way, public trails and open space areas owned or operated by the City of Santa Maria. Responsible for ensuring that public facilities are reasonably safe for public use; provides a deterrent to unacceptable behavior by maintaining high visibility at City facilities; explains and interprets park rules and other applicable regulations to patrons and the general public; issues warnings and citations when necessary within scope of responsibility; acts to diffuse difficult situations; in the absence of the Senior Parks Services Officer, works closely with the Principle Park Services Officer (department head), and the Police Department through a designated liaison appointed by the Chief of Police; while in the field requests emergency assistance from the Police Department as appropriate in detaining individuals whose actions endanger persons or property; observes and reports violations of the law; protects evidence; prepares field reports; provides security as needed at special events; provides assistance in emergencies, and administers first aid and CPR when necessary; works with local business owners, private customers, and residents on all issues related to security in the areas identified above; may prepare and present a variety of public use education programs; assists in skilled and semiskilled construction and maintenance of park facilities and performs minor servicing of equipment; provides traffic control; and performs other duties as assigned.
